15. School Learning Plan

- a. **Numeracy Focus** - How can we develop a mathematically literate student body who are able to use mathematical skills and reasoning to solve real-world problems
- b. **Focus on Equity:** - we are deeply committed to advancing student achievement in both literacy and numeracy. This dedication is evident in our daily instructional focus and our ongoing efforts to strengthen teaching practices across all grade levels.
- c. **District-wide Aboriginal Goal:** The Vancouver School Board will continue its Reconciliation journey with First Nations, Métis, and Inuit by increasing knowledge, awareness, appreciation of, and respect for Indigenous histories, traditions, cultures, and contributions.
- **Goal 1:** To improve math and literacy achievement for all students and to build positive attitudes towards math, focusing on promoting mathematical literacy among students, which involves not only developing students' skills in math but also their ability to apply mathematical reasoning to real-world situations by developing an approach to teaching math that will help ALL students:
 - Reason and analyze.
 - Take initiative to understand and solve problems.
 - Communicate mathematical thinking.
 - Develop greater flexibility, particularly, but not exclusively, in number.
 - See relationships.
 - Seek to understand why and want to make sense of ideas.
 - Look forward to figuring things out and thinking.
 - See that Math should be engaging, creative, and about making sense of the world.
 - Incorporating the **First Peoples Principles of Learning** in all curricular areas, with special attention to how it lends itself to math instruction.
- **Goal 2:** our commitment to equity means recognizing and supporting the diverse needs of all learners, those who are thriving academically and those who may require additional support. Throughout the 2025–26 school year, we will continue to embed Universal Design for Learning (UDL principles into our classrooms. These strategies ensure that all students can access learning in ways that are meaningful to them.
 - **Goal 3:** Continue our reconciliation journey with First Nations, Metis, and Inuit by:
 - a. Increasing knowledge, awareness, appreciation of, and respect for Indigenous histories, traditions, cultures, and contributions.
 - b. Aligning its policies and practices in a manner consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

• Treasurer's Report (Cheryl)

- Teacher Stipend – disbursed
 - Need to account for 3 more kids (\$20 per child pro-rated for resource teachers)
- Gaming grant received - \$4,540
 - Going to equity speaker and online safety series and STEAM.

 - Former hot lunch provider sold his assets and didn't reimburse us/payed out, lost approximately \$300 trying to follow up with the person who sold the assets. Could ask other dozen schools if they also experienced a loss
 - Need a new hot lunch provider but not a lot of turnkey providers
 - Luisa contacted Mel from Lunch Ladies — waiting to hear back if we can start late. Otherwise we will have to start in the new school year. Huge undertaking without fulfillment people. Must meet VSB requirements. Have to do an application that is approved by VSB.

- Community service/public relations person wanted to ask how school felt about the building proposal for 19.5 storeys 90 meters from the school
