Spring Highlights

Van Tech Blood Club

In April, the Van Tech Blood Club led an awareness campaign for BC Transplant, which oversees organ donation and transplantation in BC. In 2025, the province saw a record year: 575 people received transplants, including record numbers of kidney, pancreas, and islet procedures. The Blood Club is working to help break that record in 2026.

Quick facts:

- Donation is only considered after all life-saving efforts have failed.
- Anyone can register. At 19+, your decision is legally binding; under 19, it reflects your wishes. If you aren't registered, your family decides.
- You are more likely to need a transplant than to become a donor.

REDress Day

REDress Day was created by Métis artist and activist Jaime Black as an artistic response to the thousands of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two Spirit+ people across what is now Canada. It raises awareness of ongoing violence while honouring their lives, voices, and stories. "Red Dress" also plays on "re-dress," meaning to make amends and pursue justice and reparations for past and ongoing harms.

Van Tech students created several REDress Day displays. Video Production student Siena Valenta produced a hauntingly beautiful video featuring the Van Tech Chamber Choir performing the Women's Warrior Song. An art installation by Ms. Koch's English First Peoples 12 classes and Ms. Sarii's senior ceramics classes, with Education Teacher Robin Roberts, combines ceramic beads and weaving to honour women's roles in Indigenous cultures. The circular weaving symbolizes connection, continuity, and strength. Together, these works act in solidarity to honour those who are missing and murdered.

Asian Heritage Month

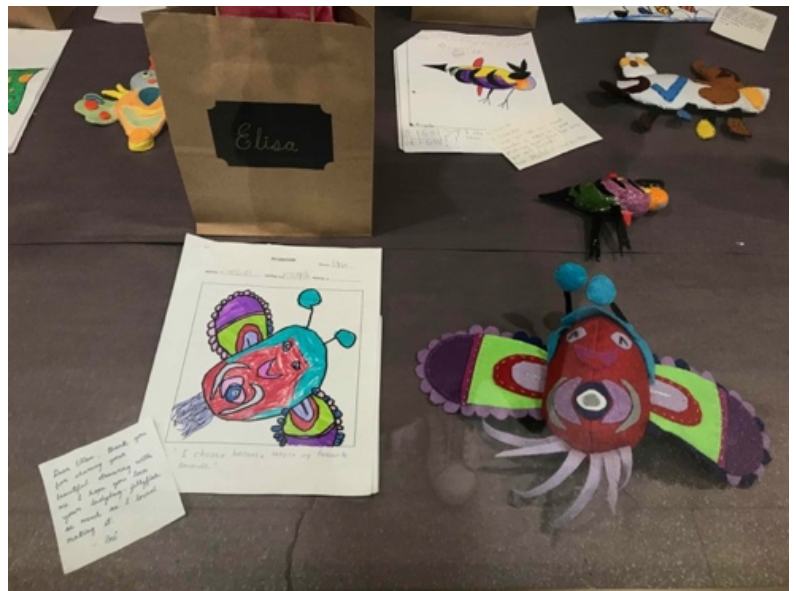

How to Access Learning Updates on MyEd

There are two types of Written Learning Updates (report cards): Mid-Semester and Summary of Learning.

Summaries of Learning (final report cards) for 2025-2026 will be published on June 25 and available on MyEd BC until August 7. It is recommended that you download and save a copy of this Learning Update for future reference. You can request copy of your Learning Update report from the main office during summer hours.

Follow these steps for access to MyEducation BC:

1. Go to <https://myeducation.gov.bc.ca/asp/en/logon.do>
 2. The login ID is your child's student number and last successful password (unless you have changed this)
- * If you haven't logged in before, the default MyEducation BC Password is set by the district to: Dist\$2026

*Please have your child contact the Main Office if their account password needs to be reset and you're unable to do so.

MyEd BC Student Family accounts will be suspended on Aug 7 to accommodate students attending Summer School, allowing them to view/download their Learning Update upon courses completion. **Students attending summer school will have their accounts reopened from August 18-22, 2026, so they may access their summer school Summary of Learning.** All student accounts (new and returning) will be enabled by 3:30 pm on Friday September 4, 2026, so that students can have access on the first day of school September 8, 2026. Students' accounts will be accessible by their last successful login ID and password.

Assessment and Learning Updates

Learning Updates provide an assessment of student progress.

What is the purpose of assessment?

The purpose of assessment is to facilitate learning and move it forward in an equitable and inclusive way. It helps students answer three questions about their learning:

- Where am I now?
- Where am I going?
- How do I get there?

Quality assessment is ongoing and responsive. It informs the instruction cycle and provides **teachers** with evidence to plan. It helps **families** understand and support their children's learning. Most importantly, it provides **students** with meaningful feedback to guide their learning and help them reflect on their growth.

How will my child be assessed?

All students will receive **Written Learning Updates** (report cards) and **Informal Learning Updates** such as telephone calls, e-mails, and conferences. Written Learning Updates will include self-reflection and goal setting, as well as descriptive feedback. The new Provincial Reporting Policy requires that students in Grades 10 -12 receive a **letter grade and percentage**, while students in Grades 8 and 9 receive grades on a **four-point proficiency scale** (Emerging, Developing, Proficient, Extending).

Comments

Please read the comments on your child's Summary of Learning carefully. These comments will highlight areas of growth in relation to the learning standards, areas for future growth, and strategies to further learning. ***If your Gr. 8 or Gr. 9 child is assessed at Emerging, the teacher MAY recommend they repeat the course. If this is the case, and you have not already done so, please contact your child's grade counsellor before Friday, June 26 or after Monday, August 31 to discuss.*** Click [HERE](#) for our staff directory.

Core Competencies

Core Competencies are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to engage in deep, lifelong learning. Along with literacy and numeracy foundations, they are central to BC's K-12 curriculum and assessment system and directly support students in their growth as educated citizens.

Vancouver students are required to reflect on Core Competencies and set goals of their choice three times each school year. **Van Tech students participated in these activities in November, February, and May by posting to their SpacesEDU digital portfolio. Please watch for an email from the VSB with a link to your child's digital portfolio.** Student development in Communication, Thinking, and Personal and Social Core Competencies at school often looks different than it does at home, so we encourage parents/caregivers to have conversations with their children about how Core Competencies can be developed in all aspects of their lives.

It is recommended that you download and save a copy of this Learning Update for future reference. Learning Updates are NOT saved on MyEd. Only the most recent Learning Updates are posted on student accounts.

Graduation Assessment Results

Students are required to write three Graduation Assessments as part of the graduation requirements: Numeracy 10, Literacy 10, and Literacy 12. French Immersion students who wish to obtain a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique must also write the French Immersion Literacy Assessment. Note that these are NOT Provincial Exams. The result a student achieves on the Assessments will not impact their academic standing.

Results

To view and download a copy of your child's results for any Graduation Assessment, go to [Student Transcripts Services](#), click on Current Student, and register for a BCeID (or login if you already have one). You will need your child's information as noted on the page. You will receive an email via the email you entered. Click the link in the email to confirm. Once you have created an account to access the site, click on "Graduation Assessment/Provincial Exam Results" to view results. This site is where you are also able to "View Your Transcript," "Send/Order Your Transcript," as well as other options. The Ministry transcript contains only your completed courses, not in-progress courses.

Flexible Instructional Time, 2026–2027

Flexible Instructional Time (FIT) will occur every day *except* Wednesday, for 40 minutes. During FIT students are expected to be engaged in a learning activity of their choice. Monday and Friday FIT runs 8:40 - 9:20 am, and students do not need to sign up in advance, but when they are in the building, they must be in a learning space, and they must sign-in to the room's Green Book for attendance in the case of an emergency. Tuesday and Thursday FIT runs 1:20 - 2:00 pm. Students must sign up for Tuesday and Thursday FIT sessions and are expected to be in the building in an area supervised by a staff member.
