Kindergarten registration starts on November 1st

With the opening of school registration for the 2019—2020 school year on November 1^{st} , the VSB will be implementing a new online registration service for parents. The registration process will have two steps:

<u>Step 1</u>: Complete the online registration process at <u>vsbapplynow.vsb.bc.ca</u> AND print out the completed registration form if your child was born in Canada.

If your child was born outside of Canada, you need to report to the VSB District Reception and Placement Centre (DRPC) at 1000 East 59th Avenue and complete the initial Kindergarten application there. Registration hours for DRPC are 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Monday to Friday on a first come, first serve basis.



Step 2: Bring the completed registration form along with the required documents to your catchment school.

Note: the registration process is not complete until you have competed both steps in the process. Visit the <u>Student Registration Page</u> on the Vancouver School Board website for more information.

Traffic—Safety and Requests

During school days it is requested that parents/guardians respect the signs at the front of the school that state "No Parking, 8:00—5:00, Monday to Friday" and "No Stopping, 8:00—5:00, Monday to Friday". As a reminder to all parents and caregivers, the following regulations are in force during school times (8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday).

- 1. When school is in session, a 30-km/h school zone speed limit is in effect from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. every school day, unless otherwise posted. Also, remember that vehicles approaching from both directions must stop for school buses when their lights are flashing.
- 2. Do not stop or park on the wrong side of the street to drop off your children. This is becoming an increasing problem and poses significant risk to our children.
- Always yield to pedestrians (it's the law). Pedestrians should cross at corners. Jaywalking or crossing in the middle of the block is very dangerous. U-TURNS ARE ILLEGAL.
- 4. When dropping off children in a school zone, stop and allow them to exit onto the sidewalk side of the car. <u>Never double</u> park and allow a child to cross mid-block.
- 5. If a vehicle is stopped in front of you or in the lane next to you, they may be yielding for a pedestrian, so be prepared to stop.

Please note that our school has partnered with the VPD, who will be randomly monitoring and ticketing drivers along Tanner and Moscrop Streets and in the surrounding area for road infractions. Thank you to those parents/guardians who comply with the rules of the road.

Extended Vacation Requests from Families during the School Year



Just a reminder to families that if you choose to go on an extended vacation during the school year, teachers are <u>NOT</u> expected to provide assignments either before or after, or give any make-up tests or examinations. It is the student's responsibility for learning any content material missed and students will be marked absent during the duration of the time away from school. Please limit your vacation so that your child is absent for a maximum of 30 school days. Please note that Graham Bruce is currently full, and we have had to place students at other schools, so if your child is away for longer than 30 days and a new

student registers at the school your space may be given to the new arrival.

Important Parental Reminders:

Please call our school at 713-4778 if your child is ill or absent from school. Also, notify our school immediately if your child has a contagious disease. This is for the safety of other students and staff at our school. Thank you.
