Masks

"I got a Soaker"

Boots are only so high – and when the water goes up and over the top, we say that a child "got a soaker." Multiple pairs of socks at school will help with this but so will a second pair of shoes. The inside of the boot often takes a while to dry and can soak a second pair of socks quickly.

At the end of our first week of the new Mask Mandate and we have done fairly well. Please continue to ensure your child has the mask to wear plus one more to cover off if the first one gets dirty. The school has a very limited supply to support forgotten masks and once used they are not returned to us, so our inventory just keeps going down. Please help us out by creating a system at your house of cleaning and replacing the masks for school. Also – names inside help a lot in returning masks to their owner.



Head Lice

We've been alerted to some cases of Head Lice in a few divisions this week. This is very common through the school year and often will come in waves. If you haven't received notification from us, it means that your class may not have been affected. If you haven't received an email, the best action you can take at this time is to plan a regular head check (e.g. pick one day on a regular basis).
