This week, our flags were at half-mast in recognition of the anniversary of the discovery of 215 unmarked graves at the site of a former residential school on the Tk'emlups te Secwepemc First Nation.


Staff have also been wearing orange – this too has been in recognition of this anniversary and a show of support of those families who have been impacted by this discovery and the legacy of residential schools.

In your community – Art Gallery steps

Since the announcement about the discovery in Kamloops one year ago, the steps of the Vancouver Art Gallery have been the site of a vigil and a gathering of children's shoes and stuffed animals. One of our school parents has shared that the organizers of the vigil are in the process of renewing the now weathered items. The current items have been cleared away and burned in ceremony and the city power washed the steps in preparation for placing new items. The school community has been welcomed to drop off donations of children's used shoes and stuffies (biased towards shoes!) at the table adjacent to the south side art gallery steps anytime. This weekend, there will also be *Prayers and Ceremony to Honour the Anniversary* on Saturday, May 28 from 12-4pm. All are welcome.
