

The SWIS Program is funded by Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and hosted by Vancouver School Board. The SWIS Program has 20 Settlement Workers (SW) and 5 Youth Settlement Workers (YSW). They assist newcomer students and families by:

- Providing opportunities for youth to become engaged and confident in their new learning environment
