### Dear LEB Families,

As we progress through Term 2, we are thrilled to see our students working hard and engaging in a variety of enriching activities. Our students have been participating in numerous field studies, both on and off campus, including workshops, ice skating and cooking classes that have been both educational and fun.

Basketball season is now underway, with games starting this week. We are excited to see our teams in action and wish them the best of luck!

In other exciting news, we have just installed a new scooter rack along the main walkway up to the front of the school. This addition will provide a convenient and secure place for students to park their scooters.

We continue to focus on engagement activities during lunchtime recess. Some of our students are helping as library monitors, some are finding a cozy spot in the main foyer to enjoy card games with friends. Also, we have a scratch coding club, creative writing club, art oratoire (public speaking) and book club. Plus, with some new sports equipment, we are rolling out soccer balls and basketballs for use during outside recess time. For our younger learners, we are reminding them of the available play options and who to ask for help if they encounter any problems.

In the coming weeks, Mme. Harcus and Mme. Jungclaus will be meeting with smaller grade groups to facilitate mini assemblies. These sessions aim to support social-emotional learning and promote fun and positive interactions during recess times.

Looking ahead, we have some special events planned. On January 29th, we will celebrate the Lunar New Year with a lion dance performance. The following day, January 30th, Constable Christie will join us for a mini assembly to discuss pedestrian safety.

As we move forward, we are also exploring ways to support our students in practicing safe online behavior. In the meantime, we encourage parents to visit <u>Common Sense Media</u> for valuable information on keeping children safe online. Additionally, we urge parents to regularly check in with their children about their online activities and overall well-being, both at school and in other settings.

We'd like to highlight that there are a few upcoming family sessions that are being offered by ERASE (Expect Respect and a Safe Education). February 4<sup>th</sup> is the next planned session and it's a remote session recommended for parents/caregivers and youth aged 10 and up as a way to facilitate the conversation of safe and caring use of technology at home and in the community (60 minute session).

At the school level we will also be working to support student learning around being a safe and caring digital citizen and classes will be participating in some ERASE sessions.

This week the weather continues to remind us that we're still well in the winter season. Please dress/remind your children to dress warm and be equipped for this polar system blowing through. Stay warm and stay well!

## **Erik Erikson's 8 Stages of Development**

Erik Erikson, a renowned psychologist, outlined eight stages of psychosocial development that people experience throughout their lives. Each stage represents a unique challenge or task that contributes to a person's sense of self and relationships. For school-age children, this often involves building confidence, navigating peer relationships, and developing a sense of competence. Understanding these stages can offer helpful insights into how children grow and adapt during different phases of life.
