
Participation in events such as information sessions, teacher conferences, and extracurricular showcases offers another meaningful way to support and celebrate our students' accomplishments.

LEARNING UPDATES (STUDENT REPORTING)

Students will receive an **electronic** Semester 1 Summary of Learning published to their [MyEducationBC](#) account on January 30. This report includes a proficiency or percentage assessment and comment from each Semester 1 teacher and a mid- semester assessment for linear (full-year) courses. **It is recommended that you download and save a copy for future reference.**

If your child receives an **Insufficient Evidence (IE)** or **Emerging** grade in any class, it is important to carefully review the teacher's comments. At the grade 8 or 9 level, an Emerging grade may indicate that summer learning could be recommended. Please note that all work must be submitted before the end of the semester to be included in the Semester 1 Summary of Learning, unless the teacher has indicated otherwise. If you have any questions about your child's progress, you are welcome to contact the teacher or your grade counsellor directly. Click [HERE](#) for our staff directory.

COURSE PLANNING

Course planning is an important opportunity for students to make choices in their learning, explore interests through electives, and meet graduation requirements. For the 2026-27 school year, this process will begin in late January. Students will work with our counselling team to receive key information through elective information sessions, graduation requirement assemblies, and Family Information Nights, where parents are encouraged to participate and support their child's planning.

The final step in the process will be for students to submit their course requests for next year using MyEducationBC. Students will complete this step in a scheduled session in the computer lab with a member of our counselling team to provide guidance and support.

A detailed schedule was also emailed out to families and posted on our website. Students can also access this information on their Grade Channel on the PW Student Hub.

Course Information Sessions- Grade Assembly

Counsellors will be meeting with grade groups during scheduled time during Experience Days of FIT sessions. The purpose of this presentation is to learn about course offerings, graduation requirements and an opportunity to ask questions. All students in Grade 8-11 are expected to attend their grade presentation in the auditorium.

Parent Information Sessions

The PW Counselling Department will be hosting one-hour sessions for parents and families (students are welcome to attend) to learn more about the course offerings for the 2025-26 school year and the course selection process. This is a great opportunity to learn about available classes, grade requirements, and post-secondary information (particularly for current grade 10 and 11 students) and to ask questions.

February 2- 17: Course Request Input

Grades 8-11 will be scheduled alphabetically during FIT to input their course requests into MyEd. They will meet a member of the counselling team in one of the computer labs.

As a reminder, a detailed course planning schedule, based on grade, has been emailed to student & families.

Counselling Update

Please note that Mr. Morgan's appointment as acting Vice-Principal at Gladstone Secondary has been extended until May. We would like to thank Mr. Kevin Land for his work with PW as an interim counsellor during Semester 1; his term concludes on January 28, 2026.

At this time, an interim counsellor has not yet been confirmed for Semester 2. Until staffing is finalized, we will be adjusting counsellor caseloads to ensure continued support for students. We recognize that this presents challenges, and we are actively working with the district to identify a longer-term solution.

EXPERIENCE DAYS

On Thursday, January 22 and Friday, January 23, 2026, students will participate in Experience Days. These are **instructional school days** focused on Career Education and experiential learning beyond the traditional classroom. There will be no regular classes on these days. Instead, students will engage in a wide range of workshops, presentations, and hands-on learning opportunities, many shaped by student interests. Grade 10 and Grade 12 students will also complete their Literacy Graduation Assessments during this time.

Students have begun selecting their choice sessions, with over 150 workshops and guest speakers offered across the two days. Depending on grade level, students will participate in a combination of grade-wide activities and choice sessions focused on enrichment, life skills, and real-world learning.

Students must complete their choice selections in FIT Planner by **Monday, January 19**. Attendance will be taken through FIT Planner, and each grade will complete a required assignment connected to their Experience Day activities. These assignments fulfill Career Education and Ministry Core Competency Reflection requirements and are attached for your reference.

If students need support with sign-up, please see Mr. Nelson in the office.

SEMESTER TURNAROUND DAYS

Monday January 26 and Tuesday January 27, 2026 are our "Semester Turnaround Days". Although these are days of instruction, no new material will be taught by your child's semester 1 teachers. Students are welcome to attend classes (during their regular semester 1 schedule class times), but attendance will not be taken on MyEd. **Teachers will request specific students to attend their class for academic recovery.**

As well, the Counselling Team will be available for course changes by appointment.

Note: Last day for course changes for Semester 2 is Friday February 6th, 2026 @ 3 pm

STUDENT COMMUNICATION

The Winter has been an exciting season for PW athletics, as our athletes have been competing in a multitude of sports.

The swim team competed at the Provincial Championships over the weekend of November 14, with several athletes advancing to Saturday's finals. In the Saturday finals, Ema A. (Grad 2026) raced in the Girls 100 SC Backstroke, while the mixed relay team competed in the 200 SC Medley. The girls relay team took part in both the 200 SC Freestyle and Medley relays.

December marked the beginning of Basketball season, With PW hosting Bantam, Juvenile, Junior and Senior teams on the boy's side, and a Juvenile and Senior team on the girls side.


The Bantam Boys continue their season following a loss to Eric Hamber. They open the new year with a home game against King George at 3:45 pm on January 14th. The Juvenile Boys carry a strong start into a vital home matchup against Lord Byng on January 12, 3:45 pm. The team is coming off an impressive 49-25 win over Point Grey, following a successful tournament in South Delta where two athletes earned tournament all-star honors, Cayden P: (Grad 2029) first-time all-star; Daniel S. (Grad 2029): second-team all-star. The Junior Boys now set their sights on University Hill after a finalist finish at the highly touted Jokers Classic in December, while the senior boys will also open the new year against University Hill, looking to build on their 4th place finish in the senior division of the Jokers Classic.

On the girls' side, both programs have opened the season with strong energy and commitment. The Juvenile Girls began league play with an impressive 2-0 start and opened the New Year on January 6 against Kitsilano Secondary, competing hard in a 46-29 loss that reflected continued growth and development. The Senior Girls also returned to action on January 6 against Eric Hamber, gaining valuable early-season experience as they continue to build chemistry and momentum heading into the heart of the season.

Table tennis also kicked off in December. Matches were competitive in losses of 4-1 and 3-2 against Point Grey and University Hill. They returned to action on January 7 against Van Tech, picking up their first win of the season, 5-0.

With spring approaching quickly, Keep an eye on team postings and your ears open for announcements regarding sign-up lists. A wide range of sports will be available this spring, including Senior Rugby, Golf, Ultimate Frisbee, girls' Soccer, boys' Volleyball, and Track and Field!
