
#### Staff News!

## **Report Cards**

As term one report cards go home on December 1<sup>st</sup>, I want to remind you of a few changes this year. First, there are now 3 terms and thus 3 reports going home during the year. Second, regarding the proficiency scale, teachers can only place students on Emerging, Developing, Proficient or Extending. They are no longer allowed to place them in-between. Thus, some teachers have added teacher comments to clarify that students are, for example, Developing in Writing but Proficient in Reading. Third, if you see "IE" (Insufficient Evidence) on a report, this replaces the old "I" (Incomplete). Fourth, each term the reports will be accompanied by Core Competency Self-Assessments as well as Goal Setting Sheets. And finally, as a reminder, Brock teachers may be using gender neutral terms – them, they and their.


The primary focus of the new reporting order is greater student self-assessment, timely and responsive feedback to parents and caregivers on student progress using language that is accessible to all parents and caregivers, and a focus on proficiency. #### **Assessment Files**

Brock has started a new assessment protocol. Each student now has an assessment file that teachers will complete during the year with a reading, writing and perhaps math assessment. This file will follow the student all the way through until the end of Grade 7, when they will be given the file to take home. Teachers recently completed their School Wide Writes (writing assessment), and some have also completed a reading assessment. The files will also house the student's Core Competencies Self-assessments and Goal setting sheets.



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
