

AUTO COLLISION AND REFINISHING



Program Outline

This Common Core program allows students to learn the fundamentals for both auto collision and auto refinishing before choosing one of the two trades for apprenticeship. These trades require good eyesight, attention to detail, and comfort with noise and vibration.

This program takes place 4 days per week for 35 weeks.

Application Process - apply in Grade 11

Start by visiting careerprograms.vsb.bc.ca to download an application. Students are encouraged to discuss the application with a school counsellor and family.

Application Deadline	March 1st
Interview Period	March - April
Acceptance Decisions	April - May
Orientation Session	June

Specific details about the Orientation Session will be included in the acceptance letter. Students must attend along with a parent or guardian.

Program Location & Intake Dates

The Foundation program takes place at the VCC Broadway campus.

The program starts in September and February each year. Applying early will allow Career Programs to determine seat availability.

Additional Information

Eligibility

This program is available to students who hold Canadian citizenship or Permanent Resident status and who attend a Vancouver School Board school or alternative program.

Funding Commitment

Tuition will be paid by the VSB for the first level of training. Students are expected to pay for program supplies, equipment, tools, and PPE - approximately \$1750.
