French Immersion Summer School at Secord

Are you thinking about sending your child to the French Immersion Summer School at Secord? Here are some of the courses that Tennyson and other FI schools' teachers will be offering this summer from July 8th to July 26th. Primary:

Early Success in French Immersion (AM and PM): Come join one of Tennyson's teachers for a sneak peek of Grade 1. This course is designed for students who have completed Kindergarten in English or French and who are going to Grade 1 French Immersion. Students will be introduced to Grade 1 French vocabulary and Math concepts, and simple routines and songs in French in order to have a successful start in Grade 1 next September.

Games and Theatre for French Literacy (Grades 1-3) (AM): Students will develop written and spoken literary skills as well as build their confidence in French through various interactive physical and drama activities, and board games chosen to make learning real and enjoyable. The summer environment is motivating and enables all students to be successful with their learning.
