## Good to Know

Graduation credit is based on credits earned in grades 10, 11 and 12

Most courses are 4 credits each

Students require a total of 80 credits to graduate
(a combination of required courses and electives)
Students in the English program will write 3 graduation
assessments

Students in the French Immersion program will write 4 graduation assessments

## Dual Dogwood French <br> Immersion

To graduate with both diplomas, French Immersion students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood Diploma, and of these 80 credits, they must earn:

Timetables are built based on student choice. It is not always possible to accommodate 1st choices, so it is in the student's best interest to include 2 alternative choices for EACH elective on MyEducationBC.

Classes should be chosen based on your child's interests/passions and/or post-secondary research

## Important Considerations

Choosing classes based on friends does not guarantee they will be in the same class

Choosing classes based on the teacher is not effective as teachers do not have their teaching assignments yet

We are not able to accommodate specific teacher requests

## Summer School

- There are different types of summer school courses.
- Review courses are for students who need more practice with the core competencies for a specific course (ie. Math)
- Preview courses are for students who would like to learn about the topics and material for a course before they take it.
- Completion courses are available for grade 10, 11, and 12 courses. If your child intends on taking a Completion course during the summer, please be aware of three things:

1. If your child signs up for a completion course, they should request the next level course in their course planning
2. Students in the grade have priority for the courses in that grade (if your child completes Math 10 in the summer, they are not guaranteed a seat in Precalculus 11).
3. Students must hand in a "Summer School Letter of Intent"
