# **Course Planning for Next School Year: 2026-27**

Course Planning timelines are significantly earlier this year to align with new budget and planning timelines. This means students are selecting their courses for the 2026-2027 school year in January 2026.

All information pertaining to our Course selection can be found on our <u>course-planning page</u> (Please note that we are still updating all the information on this page. We will aim to have the course planning guide updated by December 11<sup>th</sup>.)

**Planning Principles:** Schools build their schedules and allocate staffing based on student requests. It is imperative that student requests are accurate. If students change their minds about an elective choice, it is very possible (perhaps highly likely) they will not get into that course if they request a change in August/September. Additionally, if students plan to take a course online or in summer school to accelerate their program in a particular subject, they must request the correct grade level based on this plan. For example, if they plan to take Math 9 online, they must select Foundations of Math and Pre-Calculus 10 (FMP 10) in course planning. If they do not request FMP10 during January's course planning time, they will likely not get into the course in the following school year. Also, if they plan for FMP10 and then don't follow through with completing math 9 online, while we will make every effort to find a spot in a class they need (i.e. math 9), it's possible that the class will be full. This principle applies at every grade level.

So, please look at the course planning guide and have clear and thorough conversations about course planning and choose the courses students intend to take and be prepared to stick with these choices!

One more note about expectations: grades 8-10 students are expected to have 8 classes on timetable (between 8:40 and 3:00pm). Grade 11 students are expected to have at least 7 courses on timetable. Grade 12 students are expected to have at least 6 courses on timetable. If a student has circumstances for which they would like to request a reduction of on timetable courses (high performance athletics or fine arts programs outside of school, health concerns, etc.), please make requests for these accommodations in January 2026 and not September 2026. Students cannot drop courses that result in partial/reduced schedules in August / September 2026. The next window to drop courses opens after the first quarter in November 2026 and is granted on a case-by-case basis.

**Student course selection presentations:** Wednesday, January 14 in the auditorium. (period 1 - grade 8s, period 2 - grade 9s, period 3 - grade 10s, period 4 - grade 11s).

**Parent course selection presentations:** Thursday, January 15<sup>th</sup> in the school auditorium. 5:00 -6:00pm grade 8's/9's (juniors)

7:00 -8:00pm grade 10's/11's (seniors).

We look forward to seeing parents come out and hope that you bring all your questions.

Course selection entries into MyEd open on January 15th and close on January 26th.


