
Movie Days

New Playground

Over the last several years, the PAC used every opportunity to raise funds for a new primary playground for the school.

Several events and fundraisers later, a grand total of \$105,000 was used to purchase the new playground!

The playground was finally assembled in the summer of 2023 and at last the playground is open and is now available to all the children!

The Playground is open!



Sensory Room

The PAC took on raising funds to build a calming space in our new school. This room is designed to be a tranquil space to help students engage their sensory needs and self-regulate with interactive lighting, calming colours, and the soothing sounds of bubbles, nature, and soft music. The goal of a calming space is to provide a quiet, relaxing, and therapeutic environment for students who may have extra challenges thriving in busy, bright and loud spaces. Thanks to family donors, Shoppers Drug Mart, the Vancouver Rotary Club, and Variety Children's Charity, we raised \$17,143 to purchase items for use in the calming space, other equipment for proprioceptive input, and items for support workers to use with students to ease transitions and facilitate social skills. The room is still awaiting installation of the tropical fish projector and mirrors, but students are loving the bubble tube, light table, sound machine, and starry sky lights so far!

New Hot Lunch Program

This year the PAC brought in a hot lunch program for the second half of the year.

It was brought in as a test program to see how the parents / guardians and children alike would feel about this option. Uptake has been very positive right from the start and continues to carry forward with each month of orders.
