### February Changes to the regular schedule

Tuesday, February 13<sup>th</sup> – PM Collaborative Day, early dismissal for students Friday, February 16<sup>th</sup> – District Wide Professional Development Day, no school for students Monday, February 19<sup>th</sup> – BC Family Day, school closed

### Semester Turnaround

February 1<sub>st</sub> and 2<sub>nd</sub> are semester turnaround days. On these days classes will not be scheduled but students are able to come to school to finish off and submit work as needed. Semester 2 starts on February 5<sup>th</sup>.

### **Report Cards**

As we are approaching the end of semester 1 here is some information related to Student Progress Reports. Reports are published 3 times each semester. The interim provides comments on a learning standard where students are showing a strength, an area of growth, and the next steps (often tied to the learning standard where the student can grow). The Mid-semester and Final reports will contain a proficiency scale indicator (EMG, DEV, PRF, EXT) for Grades 8 and 9 and a percentage % for students in Grades 10 to 12. All students will receive a strength-based comment that describes their progress in relation to the learning standards.

Students in full-year courses will be assessed on the first-semester Mid-Year report, the first-semester Final report, and the second-semester Final report.

All reports will be published and are accessible on the MyEdBC website. Emails will be sent home as a reminder on the days the reports are published. Please remember to download the reports and save them onto your computer. The table below shows this year's publishing dates.

Final Report Cards for semester 1 will be published on Friday, February 8<sup>th</sup>. You will be able to retrieve them on <u>MyEducationBC</u> by 4pm.

### **Graduation Status**

Starting in the 2023-24 school year, students in Grades 10-12 will receive a Graduation Status Update with their February and June report card. <u>This is a brochure</u> from the BC government with more information. ### **Course Planning**

Course Planning has begun for students for the 2024/2025 school year. While it may seem early to begin thinking about the next school year in February, we start the planning process early to ensure we are able to run as many courses as possible for students.

It is important that you make sure you and your child can log into MyEducation BC. In addition to viewing marks, report cards and attendance data, your child and you will be using MyEducation BC to enter, edit, and view course requests. Every student has access to their MyEd account. Please have them open their account for you to view this important information with them.

#### MyEducationBC will be open for course selection from now until February 23th.

It is also important to note that course requests are not guaranteed. Your child may not get the courses they requested if there is insufficient enrollment or conflicts with other classes. We always do our very best, but sometimes we cannot fulfill first choices. Given that the classes we run are based on student requests, it is important that these course choices are thoughtfully considered for September.

#### VSB Career Programs

Grade 10 or 11 students who apply could get a head start on career training and the school district pays the tuition. That's right, **free tuition** and a chance to get started early on training or an apprenticeship while still graduating on-time.

Grade 12 students interested in an apprenticeship in a construction trade could start early, earn credits towards graduation, and start earning a paycheque as early as Semester 2 of this school year.


