Communicating Student Learning

Final Report Cards for Semester 1 were published on Thursday, January 30th. You can retrieve them on <u>MyEducationBC</u> by logging into your child's account.

Report Publication Schedule:

- Reports are published three times each semester.
 - Interim Report: Provides comments on a learning standard where students show a strength, an area for growth, and next steps (often tied to the learning standard where the student can grow).
 - Mid-Semester and Final Reports: Contain a proficiency scale indicator (EMG, DEV, PRF, EXT) for Grades 8 and 9, and a percentage (%) for students in Grades 10 to 12. All students receive a strength-based comment describing their progress in relation to the learning standards.

Full-Year Courses:

- Students in full-year courses will be assessed on:
 - First-semester Mid-Year report
 - First-semester Final report
 - Second-semester Final report

Accessing Reports:

- All reports are published and accessible on the MyEdBC website.
- Reminder emails will be sent home on the days the reports are published.
- Please remember to download and save the reports onto your computer.

Course Planning

Course Planning has begun for students for the 2025/2026 school year. While it may seem early to begin thinking about the next school year in February, we start the planning process early to ensure we are able to run as many courses as possible for students.

It is important that you make sure you and your child can log into MyEducation BC. In addition to viewing marks, report cards and attendance data, your child and you will be using MyEducation BC to enter, edit, and view course requests. Every student has access to their MyEd account. Please have them open their account for you to view this important information with them.

MyEducationBC will be open for course selection from now until February 19th.

It is also important to note that course requests are not guaranteed. Your child may not get the courses they requested if there is insufficient enrollment or conflicts with other classes. We always do our very best, but sometimes we cannot fulfill first choices. Given that the classes we run are based on student requests, it is important that these course choices are thoughtfully considered for September.

Robotics Team

The Killarney Robotics Team, KNOTbot, has worked hard since the beginning of the school year and have made excellent progress. They previously competed in a competition in December but unfortunately faced many technical issues, resulting in poor performance. That did not stop them, however. They have worked tirelessly for a month to improve their robot to endure the challenges of the game, all in preparation for the next competition.

Saturday, January 18th was last opportunity to advance to provincials, the competition was very intense, competing against 20 teams from across the lower mainland. In qualification matches, the


team won just over half of their matches, putting them in 5th place. During alliance selection, they were selected by the

team from Prince of Wales Secondary, and they competed together in the playoff matches. Unfortunately, the team did not perform as well as they hoped. In the first match, they lost by a huge margin, but the second match ended in a narrow victory. In their final match, they performed much better than all their previous matches but still lost the game. This resulted in a ranking of 3rd place. The competition was not over, however. At the awards ceremony, the team was elated to hear their team's name announced for the winner of the Think Award. This award would advance them to the provincial competition, the BC Championship, on February 22nd and 23rd. This competition was in Victoria, so they will have to go on a trip to compete.

Competing in these competitions, especially overnight ones across a ferry ride, are not easy. Expenses include buying parts, competition fees, transportation, hotels, and much more. The team has done many fundraising events to raise the necessary money. Some include a cookies sale at the school, and donuts sales at nearby stores. They have also received support from KPAC and would like to thank them for their gracious support.

The Killarney Robotics Club is open to all students to join. If this sounds interesting and you would like to take part in something similar, or just to experiment with robotics, join the club! Meetings are held each Thursday afterschool until 4pm in room A335.
