

Your version of the **OurSCHOOL** student survey measures 34 indicators based on the most recent research on school and classroom effectiveness. This report provides highlights based on data from 534 students in this school that participated in the survey between 8 May. 2018 and 17 May. 2018. The number of students by grade level is:

## Social-Emotional Outcomes

#### Student participation in school sports


Students who play sports with an instructor at school, other than in a gym class.


- 46% of students in this school had a high rate of participation in sports; the Canadian norm for these grades is 46%.
- 42% of the girls and 49% of the boys in this school had a high rate of participation in sports. The Canadian norm for girls is 41% and for boys is 50%.


#### Student participation in school clubs

Students who take part in art, drama, or music groups; school clubs; or a school committee.

- 37% of students in this school had a high rate of participation in clubs; the Canadian norm for these grades is 41%.
- 36% of the girls and 39% of the boys in this school had a high rate of participation in clubs. The Canadian norm for girls is 47% and for boys is 34%.







#### Students with a positive sense of belonging

Students who feel accepted and valued by their peers and by others at their school.

- 55% of students in this school had a high sense of belonging; the Canadian norm for these grades is 70%.
- 51% of the girls and 63% of the boys in this school had a high sense of belonging. The Canadian norm for girls is 70% and for boys is 70%.

#### Students with positive relationships


Students who have friends at school they can trust and who encourage them to make positive choices.


- In this school, 74% of students had positive relationships; the Canadian norm for these grades is 76%.
- 78% of the girls and 70% of the boys in this school had positive relationships. The Canadian norm for girls is 81% and for boys is 71%.


#### Students that value schooling outcomes


Students who believe that education will benefit them personally and economically, and will have a strong bearing on their future.

- 59% of students in this school valued school outcomes; the Canadian norm for these grades is 71%.
- 60% of the girls and 61% of the boys in this school valued school outcomes. The Canadian norm for girls is 74% and for boys is 67%.









#### Students that are regularly truant

Students who skip classes or miss days at school without a reason, or arrive late for school or classes.

- In this school, the student truancy rate was 31%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 31%
- In this school, the truancy rate for girls was 29% and for boys, 31%. The Canadian norm for girls is 28% and for boys is 34%.

#### Students with positive homework behaviours


Students who do homework for their classes with a positive attitude and in a timely manner.


- In this school, 56% of students had positive homework behaviours; the Canadian norm for these grades is 58%.
- 65% of the girls and 51% of the boys in this school had positive homework behaviours. The Canadian norm for girls is 67% and for boys is 50%.


#### Students with positive behaviour at school


Students that do not get in trouble at school for disruptive or inappropriate behaviour.

- In this school, 93% of students had positive behaviour; the Canadian norm for these grades is 87%.
- 96% of the girls and 94% of the boys in this school with positive student behaviour at school. The Canadian norm for girls is 93% and for boys is 82%.










#### Students who are interested and motivated

- 27% of students in this school were interested and motivated; the Canadian norm for these grades is 27%.
- 26% of the girls and 29% of the boys in this school were interested and motivated. The Canadian norm for girls is 27% and for boys is 27%.


Students who try hard to succeed in their learning.


- 55% of students in this school tried hard to succeed; the Canadian norm for these grades is 68%.
- succeed. The Canadian norm for girls is 71% and for boys is 64%.

#### Skills (grades)-challenge

Students who feel challenged in their Language Arts, Math and Science classes and feel confident of their skills in these subjects.

- 63% of students in the school had scores that placed them in the desirable quadrant with high skills and high challenge. The Canadian norm for these grades is 52%.
- 15% of students were confident of their skills but did not find classes challenging. The Canadian norm for these grades is 22%.
- 19% of students were not confident of their skills and found language arts, math or science challenging. The Canadian norm for this category is 22%.
- 3% of students lacked confidence in their skills and did not feel they were challenged. The Canadian norm for this category is 4%.





#### Students with moderate or high levels of anxiety

Students who have intense feelings of fear, intense anxiety, or worry about particular events or social situations.

- 36% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety; the Canadian norm for these grades is 18%.
- 43% of the girls and 28% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety. The Canadian norm for girls is 21% and for boys is 14%.

#### Students with moderate or high levels of depression


Students who have prolonged periods when they feel sad, discouraged, and inadequate.


- 34% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of depression; the Canadian norm for these grades is 18%.
- 41% of the girls and 25% of the boys in this school had moderate to high levels of depression. The Canadian norm for girls is 21% and for boys is 15%.


#### Students with a positive self-esteem


Students who like and accept themselves, and are proud of their accomplishments.

- 56% of students in this school had high self-esteem; the Canadian norm for these grades is 76%.
- 53% of the girls and 62% of the boys in this school had high self-esteem. The Canadian norm for girls is 72% and for boys is 79%.

#### Average percentage in Language Arts

Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Language Arts class (e.g., English) were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.

- In this school, students' average reported mark was 79%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 78%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 81% and boys' was 78%. The Canadian norm for girls is 80% and for boys is 76%.

#### Average percentage in Math


Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Math class were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.


- In this school, students' average reported mark was 78%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 76%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 78% and boys' was 78%. The Canadian norm for girls is 77% and for boys is 76%.


#### Average percentage in Science


Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Science class (e.g., general Science, biology, chemistry, or physics) were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.

- In this school, students' average reported mark was 78%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 77%.
- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 79% and boys' was 78%. The Canadian norm for girls is 78% and for boys is 76%.









#### Effective learning time

Important concepts are taught well, class time is used efficiently, and homework and evaluations support course objectives.

- In this school, students rated effective classroom learning time 6.2 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 6.4.
- In this school, effective classroom learning time was rated 6.2 out of 10 by girls and 6.3 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 6.5 and for boys is 6.3.




Students who find classroom instruction relevant to their everyday lives.


- In this school, students rated relevance 5.5 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.8.


#### Rigor


Students who find the classroom instruction is well-organized, with a clear purpose, and with immediate and appropriate feedback that helps them learn.

- In this school, students rated rigor 6 out of 10.
- In this school, rigor was rated 6 out of 10 by girls and 6.1 out of 10 by boys.









#### Bullying, exclusion, and harassment

Students who are subjected to physical, social, or verbal bullying, or are bullied over the internet.

- 18% of students in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month; the Canadian norm for these grades is 21%.
- 16% of the girls and 19% of the boys in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month. The Canadian norm for girls is 19% and for boys is 24%.




Students who feel safe at school as well as going to and from school.


- 53% of students felt safe attending the school; the Canadian norm for these grades is 65%.
- 54% of the girls and 55% of the boys felt safe attending the school. The Canadian norm for girls is 64% and for boys is 65%.


#### Advocacy at school


Students who feel they have someone at school who consistently provides encouragement and can be turned to for advice.

- In this school, students rated advocacy at school 1.8 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 2.6.
- In this school, advocacy at school was rated 1.5 out of 10 by girls and 2 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 2.6 and for boys is 2.7.










#### Positive teacher-student relations

Students who feel teachers are responsive to their needs, and encourage independence with a democratic approach.

- In this school, positive teacher-student relations were rated 5.9 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.9.
- In this school, positive teacher-student relations were rated 5.8 out of 10 by girls and 6.1 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 6 and for boys is 5.8.




There are clear rules and expectations for classroom behaviour. Students understand these and teachers maintain high expectations that they be followed.


- In this school, students rated disciplinary climate of the classroom 5.9 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.8.


#### **Expectations for success**


The school staff emphasizes academic skills and hold high expectations for all students to succeed.

- In this school, students rated teachers' expectations for academic success 6.9 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 7.
- In this school, teachers' expectations for academic success were rated 7 out of 10 by girls and 6.9 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 7.2 and for boys is 6.8.










#### Advocacy outside of school

- In this school, students rated advocacy outside of school 4.1 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 4.4.
- In this school, advocacy outside school was rated 3.9 out of 10 by girls and 4.2 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 4.5 and for boys is 4.4.





Students who plan to finish high school.


- 78% of students in this school had aspirations for finishing high school; the Canadian norm for these grades is 83%.
- 80% of the girls and 76% of the boys in this school had aspirations for finishing high school. The Canadian norm for girls is 87% and for boys is 79%.


# Students planning to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program Students who plan to finish high school, and afterwards pursue a trade or apprenticeship program.

- 16% of students in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program; the Canadian norm for these grades is 19%.
- 12% of the girls and 20% of the boys in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program The Canadian norm for girls is 16% and for boys is 23%.











#### Students planning to go to college or university

Students who plan to pursue a post-secondary education.

- 58% of students in this school had aspirations for pursuing a post-secondary education; the Canadian norm for these grades is 66%.
- 62% of the girls and 55% of the boys in this school had aspirations for going to college or university. The Canadian norm for girls is 73% and for boys is 58%.

#### Language spoken at home


Students are asked to indicate the language they speak most often at home.

- 1% of students in this school speak French and another languages at home.




Students who have repeated one or more grades at school since kindergarten.


- 8% of students in this school have repeated a grade at school.
- 7.9% of the girls and 5.6% of the boys in this school have repeated a grade at school.





Students who are of Aboriginal origin, that is, First Nations, Métis, or Inuk.
