English Course Options to Fulfill REQUIREMENTS

BLUE boxes are course for students in the Main School.

YELLOW boxes are courses for students in Byng Arts.

GREEN boxes are courses open to all students, in both the Main School and Byng Arts.

ORANGE font courses are in the English First Peoples stream. Any one of these courses will fulfill the Indigenous-focused graduation requirement.

Senior English ELECTIVES

- Open to ALL students in Grades 11 & 12, both Main School and Byng Arts.
- Teacher permission is NOT required.
- CANNOT be used to replace a Grade 11 or Grade 12 Language Arts graduation requirement (e.g., English Studies 12).
- Literary Studies 12 (British Literature) counts as an approved academic course for university admission.
- Creative Writing 12 is accepted by some universities as an academic course.
- If these courses are oversubscribed, priority goes to Grade 12s. Students in the Main School and in Byng Arts will have equity of access.

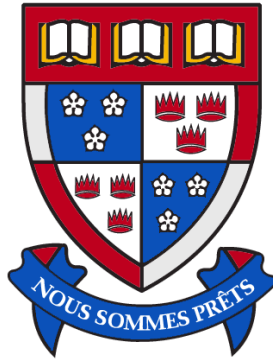
** A 2nd language is not required for graduation.

No credit

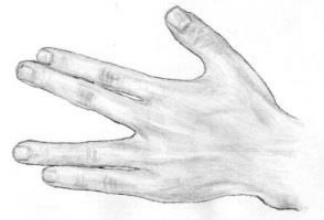
Often students in Skills have an IEP



Electives: Off Timetable &/or require Applications

- Community Service Gr 11 recommended, does not count for honour roll)
- Work Experience: Requires separate application
- **Peer Tutoring 12: Requires teacher recommendation (does not count for honour roll)
- **Peer Counselling 12 : Requires application in Grade11

Byng Arts Certification



- **Honours**: Minimum of four senior courses in their chosen field, with an average of 86% or higher.
- **Major**: Minimum of four with an average of 80% or higher.
- **Minor**: Minimum of three courses with an average of 80% or higher.
- **Interdisciplinary, Honours**: Minimum of four courses chosen from two fine art disciplines, with an average of 86% or higher.
- **Interdisciplinary, Major**: Minimum of four courses chosen from two fine art disciplines, with an average of 80% or higher.



Byng Arts – Senior Focus Areas

Visual Arts	*Studio Arts 2-D11, *Studio Arts 2-D12, (plus two other art electives – graphic arts, art studio, ceramics, photography, annual production, media design, textiles. Jewelry, metal art)
Media Arts – Video/Animation	*Media Arts 11/12 Advanced, plus a choice of Film Studies 11/12 and Media Design 11/12 (Animation)
Drama – Stage Drama/Media – Film & Television	*Theatre Company 11, *Theatre Company 12, Film Actor’s Process 11/12, Theatre Production 11/12, Media Arts 11/12 and/or Film Studies 11/12
Music - Strings	*Music 11/12: Orchestral Strings 3 Intermediate or *Music 11/12: Orchestral Strings 4 Senior, (plus two other orchestra or symphony classes)
Music - Band	*Music 11/12: Band Intermediate or *Music 11/12: Band 4 Senior Wind Ensemble , (plus two other jazz band or symphony classes)
Music - Choir	* Music 11/12 Choir 2 Junior, or 3 Intermediate, or 4 Senior, (plus two other chamber choir or vocal ensemble classes)
Literary Arts – Major/Honours	English 11 Literary Studies, English Studies 12 (AP Preparation), British Literature12, Creative Writing 12, English First Peoples 12 (3=minor, 4=major/honours)

Getting more Credits

- **Advanced Placement (AP):** @ Byng - Calculus, English (AP exam prep), French, Statistics & Computer Science
- **External Credits:** Ministry Approved (examples: BC Conservatory of Music, Canadian Forces, Cadets, Lifesaving, Red Cross, Duke of Edinburgh, Guides, Outward Bound, Rock School...)
- **Language Challenge:** Register in Oct/Nov 2022
Full day exam in Jan/Feb 2023 (\$50 fee)
Language requirement met – French, German, Japanese, Mandarin, Punjabi, Spanish, Korean (can't use for admission calc. for UBC)

In School vs Online vs Summer School

Summer school (info. in April- check VSB website)

- Remedial 2 hrs/day 4 weeks – 40-49% (maximum grade 67%)
- Completion 3.5 hrs/day 6 weeks
- Preview 2 hrs/day 4 weeks

Online/Summer – does not count for Honour Roll.

Honour Roll/Principal's List: Grade 8-11 best 7, Grade 12 best 6

The following courses are not included in honour roll: Community Service, Peer Tutoring, Career Life Education, Career Life Connections & Capstone

Gr 12 students are given priority for Gr 12 courses and Gr 11 courses required for graduation
