Check Your Requirements From Grade 11


- All students will need the following courses at the grade 11 level to graduate:
 - An English 11 (Composition, New Media, Creative Writing, or English First Peoples).
 - A Math 11 (Pre-Calculus, Foundations, or Workplace)
 - A Science 11 or 12 (Almost always an 11)
 - [Optional] Social Studies 12 (Usually taken in Grade 11)

Indigenous Grad Requirement

- The Ministry of Education requires students to take at least one course with an Indigenous focus to graduate.
 - Great news: This is easy at Van Tech as our English, Socials, and French Immersion departments have multiple options!
 - Courses that meet the criteria for 2026-27
 - English First Peoples Literary Studies & Writing 11
 - English First Peoples 12
 - BC First Peoples 12 (*Socials course*)
 - Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (*Socials course*)
 - Peoples Autochtones de la BC 12 (*French Immersion Gr 11 option*)





School Programs



- French Immersion, Flex Humanities, LAC, and Summit all continue in Grade 12.
 - If you were in a program in grade 11, it's assumed you're continuing in grade 12.
 - If you were not in one, you'll continue to not be unless you apply and are accepted (subject to room).

- French Immersion (1 course): Francais Langue 12 (Counts as an Academic 12)
- Flex Humanities (1 course): Philosophy 12 (Counts as an Academic SS12)
- LAC (4 courses): Math, Science, & Humanities
- Summit (1 course): Career Life Connections 12 (Counts as your CLC 12)



myBlueprint

- MyBlueprint is something generally introduced in the CLE 10 course. It is a FANTASTIC way to plan out your post-secondary goals. It helps you build potential futures where you can see how your course choices affect your post-s

English 12

[Required Course]

- In Grade 12 you choose one of the following three courses:
- English First Peoples 12
- English Studies 12
- AP English Literature & Composition 12
 - This is a double credit course.
 - This is an Advanced Placement course.
 - Students are strongly recommended to have 86% or better in their last completed English course.



Career Life Connections (CLC) 12


[Required Course]

- Career Life Connections 12 is an Extension of Career Life Education

You will need to complete a Capstone Project- a passion project around your area of interest that demonstrates the skills you developed in your educational experience

Students can complete this course in two ways:


- On Timetable
 - Taken for one semester.
 - You attend every second school day, alternating with a study block.
- Off-Timetable
 - Taken all year.
 - Meet one to two times a week, likely after school.





Math 12


- ▶ Grade 11 is the last required math year.
- ▶ Van Tech offers the following Grade 12 courses:
 - ▶ **Workplace Math 12**
 - ▶ **Foundations of Math 12**
 - ▶ **Pre-Calculus 12** (Required for University Science, Math, Comp Sci, Business, & Engineering)
 - ▶ **Calculus 12** (Valuable for Science, Math, Comp Sci, and Engineering)
 - ▶ **AP Calculus 12**
 - ▶ **Statistics 12**
 - ▶ **AP Statistics 12**
 - ▶ **Computer Studies 12** (Combined with Computer Programming)





Math for post secondary options

- **Precalculus 11-** Required for most Science Programs
- **Foundations of Math-** Acceptable for Arts and Humanities Programs
- **Workplace Math-** Graduation Requirement, and entry to Langara and other colleges



- You'll need a Science 11 OR 12 to graduate. Some post-secondary programs need more.
- In Grade 12 we offer:
 - AP Biology 12 (Includes 2 courses: AP Bio 12 & Bio 12 Regular. You can't split them up)
 - Biology 12: Anatomy & Physiology (Can be taken with Chem or Bio 11)
 - Chemistry 12
 - Physics 12
- Please note: Students exploring science-based university programs generally need Physics 11, Chemistry 11, and at least one (sometimes two) Grade 12 science courses.



Social Studies 12

[Optional if Completed in Grade 11]

- African Decent History 12 (*Off-Timetable, locally developed course*)
- Asian Studies 12
- BC First Peoples 12 (*Meets Indigenous grad requirement*)
- Comparative Cultures 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (*Meets Indigenous grad requirement*)

- Economic Theory 12 (*Only offered in even years*)
- Law Studies 12
- Philosophy 12
- Political Studies 12 (*New course, offered in odd years*)
- Queer and Trans History 12(*Off-Timetable, locally developed course*)
- Social Justice 12



Language Courses



- Language Courses:
 - Language courses are optional for all university programs starting in 2026 or later across Canada (*exception of Quebec, where some have French requirements*).
 - **A language Grade 12 makes for an excellent academic 12 course for university.**
 - Some humanities-based UBC degrees have a requirement to take a second language in university, so previous knowledge can help.


Learning Hub Support

- Students have access to various learning supports, from full-time enrollment in the Learning Hub's competency-based curriculum to "drop-in-as-needed" assistance for immediate help with courses.
- The Learning Hub has a team of teachers available to support students in every subject.
- Teachers are available throughout the day, providing targeted and individualized support tailored to each student's specific learning needs.



Electives!

- We are INCREDIBLY lucky in that Van Tech is a big school with keen teachers. We have a massive catalogue of courses, especially electives.
 - Use the course choices guide Ms. Ross is providing and ask as many questions as you like.
- Grade 12 Applied Skills & Fine Arts courses are usually combined with Grade 11s.
- Students DO NOT need to have taken a lower grade elective to do the higher level one.
Example: You can take Foods 11 without having taken Foods 9 or 10.
 - Exceptions: Accounting 12 (needs Accounting 11) and Art/AP Art 12 (needs Art 11)
- Students can receive credit in both years if they select a course area both years.
- Students can also sign up to be a “CS” with a teacher for a block.
- Students can meet with Ms. Ross to discuss being a Peer Tutor.



Off-Timetable Courses

- Van Tech has many Off-Timetable courses that happen before school, during lunch, or after school. Here is the list for your reference:
 - *African Decent History 12 (Elective Social Studies course; Wednesdays after school)*
 - *Chamber Choir 12 (Morning; audition required)*
 - *CLC 12 (Graduation requirement that can be done this way; likely once a week)*
 - *Concert Choir 12 (Lunch, no audition)*
 - *Leadership 11-12 (Twice a week, including a morning)*
 - *Mental Health Leadership 10-12 (Wednesdays after school)*
 - *Orchestra/Strings 12 (Tuesday/Thursday after school)*
 - *Peer Tutoring 12 (Off or On Timetable; Off timetable would be during FIT or Lunch)*
 - *Queer & Trans History of BC 12 (Elective Social Studies course; Mondays after school)*
 - *Retail Business 10-12 (New course! Thursday 7:30-8:30 and one lunch every two weeks)*
 - *Vocal Jazz 12 (Morning; audition required)*



Study Blocks!

- Grade 12s can APPLY, with caregiver backing, for a study block.
 - This takes the place of one of your eight blocks.
 - You complete a form provided by Ms. Ross with your caregiver(s).
- Remember that many universities are asking for DEPTH of study, not just great marks, so students are encouraged to take a wide variety of courses.

Course Changes!

- The ONLY reason to change a course will be-
 - 1) You did not get any of your elective choices (Or alternates)
 - 2) You require a course for university entrance or graduation (Ex: Choice of Math course)
- 3) You completed a course in Summer School and need an elective replacement



Summer School, Fails, & Getting Ahead

- Students may make up courses they haven't passed in summer school. Students can also use summer school to get ahead in certain courses.
 - Summer school applications open in early May.
 - Ms. Ross will post information about signing up when we're in April.
- Many students may choose to get AHEAD in their courses by taking a grade 12 course in summer school. Doing so means you can take an extra elective of your choice in the next school year.

- **Trades Training** – See Ms. Ross if you don't already know about the Youth in Trades program that gets free first year apprenticeship schooling.
 - Lots more info here: <https://www.vsb.bc.ca/career-programs/page/11419/program-offerings>
 - Most programs have application deadlines of March 1st, 2025 (Grade 11).
- **College** – First-come-first-serve, smaller classes, pathways to university, and more.
- **University** – Degree-based programs. Pathways to Masters/Doctorate degrees.
- **Upgrading/Adult Education** – See Ms. Ross if you want to upgrade your marks after graduation.
- **Straight to Work** – Life is expensive. If you want to get money saved for more education, it's a great plan.
- **Gap Year** – Build some personal awareness, see the world, and 'defer' your post-secondary offer for a year.


Where do my averages come from?

- Universities typically have point score methods to form averages
- Priority 1: Grade 12 courses Listed for your Required Major
- Example: UBC Science: English 12, Precalc 12, Science 12
- Priority 2: Other Grade 12 Academic Courses
- Priority 3: Grade 11 Courses *Where a Grade 12 mark does not exist*
- **Example: Pre-calc 11, superseded by Pre calc 12 Mark**
- **Will Blend averages depending on the school**



University Transfer Programs

- Over the last decade+ universities and colleges have started working together.
 - Universities have high drop out rates in year one and two and want to fill seats.
 - Colleges want to get more students by offering extensions to their diplomas.
- University transfer is the process of doing a year or two at a college and then transferring over for year and four.
- Advantages:
 - Cheaper tuition while in college.
 - Smaller class sizes for year one and two.
 - Softer landing leaving high school.
 - Better chance of getting in overall (compared to straight out of high school)





Post-Secondary, Scholarships, & Graduation Family Evening – Sept 2026

- In September of Grade 12, Ms. Ross and the wonderful VT staff will offer a big caregiver and student night that is strongly recommended to attend.
- There will be three major focuses:
 - Graduation – What's happening at Van Tech and when.
 - Post-secondary applications – Everything you need to know.
 - Scholarships – The three types and how to apply.
- Watch for a date at the beginning of September.





Getting Ahead: BC Student Transcripts

- Students share their official transcripts with post-secondaries they want to apply for throughout Grade 12.
- Students can get ahead of this process by making an account any time.
 - Just make sure you know your Personal Education Number (PEN).
 - Check a report card to see yours or ask Ms. Ross. It's a 9-digit number starting with 1.
 - Link: <https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/transcripts-and-certificates>
 - Doing this early means you can see and look over your transcript early. It's rare, but it's always possible a mistake is on there.





Entering your course selections – Ms. Ross is here to help!

- To help ensure accurate information, all course entry will happen through Ms. Ross. This means students will not directly use the MyEd software.
- **Each student will drop off their course selection form to Ms. Ross at the required time.**
 - Semester 1 students: Feb 5rd
 - Semester 2 students: Feb 19th
- Not getting your form in on time means less chance of getting the classes you want.
- Want to make a change to your course choices? Email Ms. Ross or come on by her office.
