Post Secondary Planning Guide – M. DeYoung

Dear Grads of 2024,

In this booklet you should find some useful information that will help you on your journey through the next 18 months. There is no "right way" to work your way through the next few months on your journey to post-secondary whether that is University, College, work, trades, a GAP year etc. Ask for help when you need it, be responsible and take ownership of your future, be informed, and take the time to make plans. "If you fail to plan, you plan to fail."

I strongly encourage you to take ownership by:

- Attending any University presentations here at Kits OR in the community
- Check your TEAMS grade page daily and check your emails often
- Visit post-secondary schools if they are close by to see what the campus is like. Schools often offer tours for perspective students.
- Use a calendar to fill in dates of when the Colleges/Universities of your choice require applications for programs and scholarships.
- Apply for as many scholarships as you can. Some of the websites you can visit are:

- Use Education Planner BC https://educationplannerbc.ca/ to make plans, search for programs and to apply to BC post-secondary schools.

This year will be full of ups and downs like every other, so in order to keep your best physical and mental health in check you should:

- Keep things in perspective and count your blessings. Try to find something to be grateful for every day.
- Clearly communicate your needs to parents, friends, teachers, your counsellor, your boss, your coach, your teammates, etc. Many people out there WANT to help you, but can't help if we don't know what you want or need.
- Recognize that it is a privilege to be getting an education, respect that by: Attending all of your classes, arriving on time, ready to work and being prepared.
- Do not over extend yourself. It's better to do one or two things well, than to try and do 5 things poorly.
- Use your calendar or agenda daily
- Get enough sleep, drink water, eat healthy foods, spend some time in nature. ALL of these will contribute to a healthy you. When you feel panicked or filled with anxiety practice some deep breathing or use an APP that guides you through some easy meditation/breathing exercises. Some apps that I suggest are Calm, Headspace, or Mindshift.

Things you'll need to know for applying to Post-Secondary Institutions. Please note that you will **NOT** need to use the Student Transcript Service UNTIL you are in Grade 12 and are ready to apply for Post Secondary School.

To have your official transcripts sent to the post-secondary institutions you are applying to, you MUST create an account (After November 1, 2023) on the Student Transcript Service Website. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/transcripts-and-certificates

Transcripts for Secondary Students

A transcript is an official record of your high school marks. Current and former BC secondary school students will need to provide their Personal Education Number (PEN) when applying to a post-secondary institution (PSI). If you are unsure about how to obtain your PEN or don't have one, please submit a PEN request to the Ministry of Education.

You can easily send your official transcript electronically or by mail to a PSI using the <u>StudentTranscript</u> service.

Take a look at the <u>Student Help Videos</u> from the Ministry of Education for step-by-step tutorials on obtaining BCeID as well as ordering and sending your transcripts.

Note: Many PSIs require official transcripts to be sent directly from the Ministry of Education (either electronically or in printed form) and will not accept transcripts that are not in an official sealed envelope or that have been photocopied.

Before you access the StudentTranscripts Service as a current student, you will need

- Your Personal Education Number (PEN)
 - o Check your report card or contact your school to find your PEN. See Find Your PEN
- A valid email address
- Your date of birth
- Your legal first and last name

You must register for a Basic BCeID account to access the StudentTranscripts Service.

APPLYING TO UNIVERSITIES

COLLEGES THAT OFFER UNIVERSITY TRANSFER COURSES

Langara College, Vancouver Community College and Douglas College are University Colleges. They are Degree Granting institutions that may offer a host of Associate and Applied degree programs in addition to the very popular one and two yar UNIVERSITY TRANSFER PROGRAMS to other BC universities. Generally, these colleges operate on a first come, first served basis so apply early in your grade 12 year. Most of the applications for these institutions open October 1st (of your Gr. 12 year). The usual deadline for US College applications is the end of December so start your application process early.
