

Overview of Mathematics Pathways





3. **IN-PERSON SEMINARS** – What to expect:

- During the 2nd week of April, during a FIT time you will have a seminar to attend
- You will be working in pairs/small groups and reflecting on/discussing your takeaways from the course.
 A teacher will be there to help guide these questions and facilitate the conversations.
- You will then complete a **Course Reflection and Self-Assessment** on Microsoft Forms.
- 4. The **FINAL** activity for the course is to attend the **Capstone Showcase** in early June and complete a reflection assignment. Grade 12 students across BC complete this course as a Graduation requirement. This will give you an idea of where you're going and maybe get you thinking about what you might want to pursue!
