



Dogwood Diploma

The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "Dogwood Diploma" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

Students require a minimum of 80 credits to graduate.

Of these 80 credits:

Requirements

- At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 and Career Life Connections
- At least 28 credits must be elective course credits
- Effective July 1, 2023: At least 4 credits must have an Indigenous focus.
- 52 credits are required from the following:
 - Career-Life Education (4 credits), and Career-Life Connections (4 credits)
 - Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
 - Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Language Arts 10, 11 and a required 12 (12 credits total)
 - An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits total)

In addition, students must also complete three graduation assessments:

The Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment was introduced in 2018

The Grade 10 Literacy Assessment was introduced in 2019/20

The Grade 12 Literacy Assessment will be introduced in 2021/22


Senior English ELECTIVES

- Open to ALL students in Grades 11 & 12, both Main School and Byng Arts.
- Teacher permission is NOT required.
- CANNOT be used to replace a Grade 11 or Grade 12 Language Arts graduation requirement (e.g., English Studies 12).
- Literary Studies 12: British Literature counts as an approved academic course for university admission.
- Creative Writing 12 is accepted by some universities as an academic course.
- If these courses are oversubscribed, priority goes to Grade 12s. Students in the Main School and in Byng Arts will get equity of access.

- •Learn a new world of culture, language and different perspectives
- •Nice to complete a language up to Grade 12, to see it through and further knowledge of language
- •Good to know how to speak to family or friends who speak the language
- •Even if not required, universities like seeing a language
- •French language will be helpful in terms of finding job opportunities in Canada as well as travelling in other countries/interacting with others through French.
- •It sometimes is a requirement to get into some universities in the US

Other Benefits:

- •French is required to work for the Federal Government
- •You become smarter-it develops new neural pathways in your brain and can reduce the risk of Dementia and Alzheimer in advanced age
- •You get to participate in interesting workshops and field trips and eat delicious food from other cultures!

Program Description

Byng Arts operates as a school-within-a-school and is a community of staff, students, and parents within the larger artistic and academic communities in Vancouver. Successful applicants to Byng Arts will be students who not only direct their energy and passions towards the Fine Arts, but who are also curious, self-motivated, and have demonstrated a record of strong academic achievement.

Students in Byng Arts will have a Fine Art specialization in one of the following areas: Band, Choir, Drama, Media Arts, Strings, or Visual Arts. After Grade 10, further opportunities are available in Literary Arts. Students attend several of their academic classes together as a cohort of motivated learners - English and Social Studies classes are especially streamed for this reason and students must attend these classes with their classmates as part of the program.

In addition to an enriched curriculum, all students in Byng Arts participate in events, which feature community artists, musicians, and performers. These events strengthen the collaboration between Byng and the professional arts community. Student participation is recorded in their Byng Arts Passport and is a mandatory part of their program at Byng






Bicycle Mechanics 9-12 Sem. 2
