Schools are staffed and timetabled according to the information on these forms

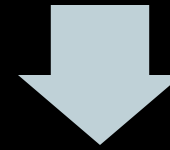


Only those courses with a sufficient number of students registered will be available

# Graduation Checklist

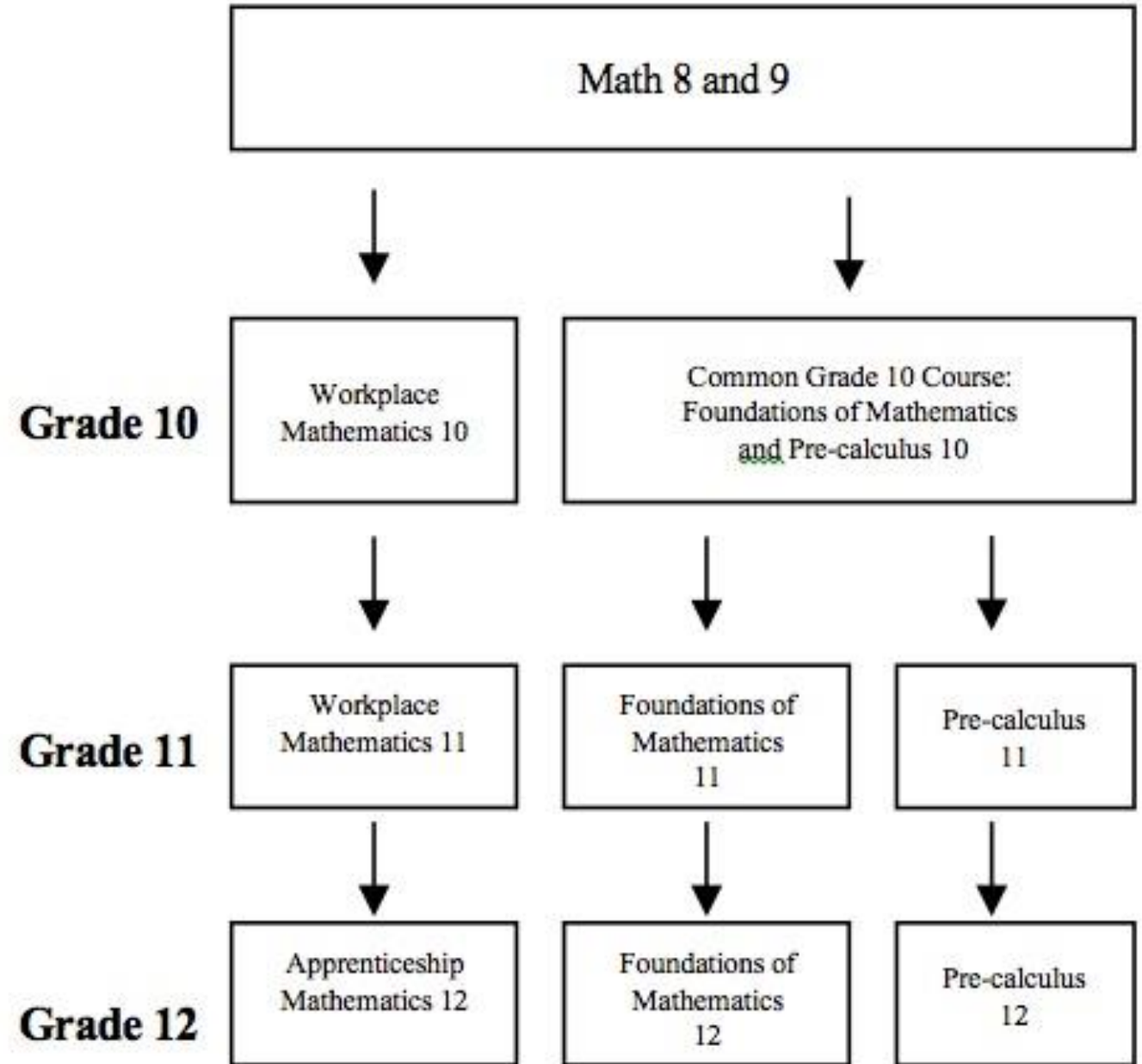

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### 1. **Professional Pathways Conversations #2** – in the library during FIT time Wednesdays

This information is posted on your **Career Ed TEAM** the week before.

We've got some awesome guests including; a psychotherapist/social worker, a personal trainer, a coastal engineer, an artist and an executive coach.

### 2. **Letter to Self** – What important messages do I want to send to Grade 12 me?

This assignment will have you reflect and think ahead to the path you choose in High School. You will receive this letter in your Grade 12 year, a full circle moment to look forward to!

This assignment will be posted on TEAMS in March and will be handed in ( **A PAPER COPY**) during your Seminar in April...

# Recap – How about all the hard work we've already completed?

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- Exploring Microsoft 365** – This assignment was created for you to learn the different functions available in the Microsoft programs AND to help you organize your classes digitally. Have you completed it yet?
- Take your Kid to Work Day** - There was an assignment to help you reflect on the workplace you visited OR an alternate assignment if you weren't able to attend a workplace.
- Cybersafe from Exploitation** – You attended an assembly that spoke about online exploitation. You were to complete a few reflection questions about what you learned.
- Elective Tours Challenge** – You heard about the courses available to you at PW to help you make informed choices for your path forward. Have you completed your activity?
- Professional Pathways Semester #1** – There were several opportunities provided over the first half of the year for you to attend. (IF you did not, you could do 2 in Semester 2.)

# The plan for Sem 2 - Continued

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## 3. **IN-PERSON SEMINARS** – What to expect:

- During the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of April, during a FIT time you will have a seminar to attend
- You will be working in pairs/small groups and reflecting on/discussing your takeaways from the course. A teacher will be there to help guide these questions and facilitate the conversations.
- You will then complete a **Course Reflection and Self-Assessment** on Microsoft Forms.

4. The **FINAL** activity for the course is to attend the **Capstone Showcase** in early June and complete a reflection assignment. Grade 12 students across BC complete this course as a Graduation requirement. This will give you an idea of where you're going and maybe get you thinking about what you might want to pursue!
