COURSE PLANNING PROCESS

Select courses based on your own interests. Choices are assorted randomly by computer into timetables.

Students don't select: their teachers, period of day when courses are scheduled, which other students are in your classes.

Making changes to courses initially selected will be limited, and if requested late, may not be possible due to course conflicts or courses being full.

- * off-timetable or other on-line courses will be additional 10th , 11th courses, etc...


Generally, students will have:

NUMERACY & LITERACY ASSESSMENTS



- All students must complete the numeracy 10 and literacy 10 assessments before graduation.
- They will not count towards your GPA.
- Currently, the grade 10 assessments are not used for post-secondary admission

ENGLISH 10

English 10 is a graduation requirement and is offered in the following combinations:

- Literary Studies 10 + Composition 10 (MLTST10 +MCMPS10)
- Literary Studies + Creative Writing (MLTST10 +MCRTWR10)
- Literary Studies 10 + New Media 10 (MLTST10 +MNMD10)

CAREER LIFE EDUCATION 10

Career Life Education 10 -- required for graduation, taught off timetable-online

There are three main areas of study in Career Life Education 10:

- **Personal Development** - goal setting, life-long learning, grad. requirements
- **Connections to Community** - identify and explore economic trends and their impact on communities, workplaces and career opportunities.
- **Career Life Plan** - explore careers, employability skills, opportunities after grad.

LEARNING HUB BLOCKS

- The “Skills Room” is now “The Learning Hub”.
- “Special Education” is now “Inclusive Education”.
- “Resource Teacher” is now “Inclusion Support Teacher”.
- Learning Hub functions as a support block, and is not for credit.
- Students are referred to Learning Hub by the Inclusion Support Teachers (Mr Saplamaeff & Ms Schultz). Please speak to an Inclusion Support Teacher if you would like a Learning Hub block.
- Learning Hub will be available to support any students who require it next year on a structured drop-in basis.

UNIVERSITY PLANNING



Science Degree Programs

- Usually requires Chemistry 11, Physics 11, Pre-Calculus 11 & 12 and two Science 12 courses.

Engineering Programs

- Usually requires Chemistry 11 & 12, Physics 11 & 12, Pre-Calculus 11 & 12, Calculus 12 recommended

Business Degree Programs

- Usually require Pre-Calculus 11 & 12 + supplemental application materials. Some universities have minimum averages set in English and Pre-Calculus 12, Calculus 12 recommended

Ontario Universities

- For Science, Engineering and Business programs, Calculus 12 is often required.

POST-SECONDARY PLANNING: AN INTRODUCTION

There are different types of post-secondary institutions (PSIs):

- * Vocational/trade/technology schools/institutes
- * Private institutions
- * Colleges
- * Universities

There are different types of qualifications/certifications:

- * Certificates – a year or less
- * Diplomas – one to two years
- * Associate Degrees – two years then transfer to a university to complete the degree
- * Degrees – a Bachelor degree takes 4 years of full-time study

There are different admission requirements and standards for each program.



UNIVERSITY PLANNING CONT.

Broad Based Admissions

This refers to additional considerations, beyond marks, that are taken into account for admission decisions. Here are some examples:

Fine Arts Programs – usually include a portfolio, audition or written submissions.


Business Degree Programs – often require information about leadership, volunteering, community work, references, and may have a video submission or video interview.

UBC – for all programs, students are required to complete the Personal Profile and to provide references.



COURSE PLANNING PROCESS & TIMELINE

- Course Planning requests submitted into MyEd, and the Course Planning Form -signed and returned to counsellor by February 17, 2026
- Counsellor and discussions with students as needed February to April
- Student schedules randomly built based upon course requests May to June
- Timetabling conflicts resolved from June through to September
- Making changes to courses selected will be limited, and if requested late, may not be possible due to course conflicts or courses being full.



- Especially in the Gr. 12 year, issues may arise when courses required for graduation or for post-secondary admission are not completed in a timely manner. These institutions may impose specific deadlines for progress or completion of online courses.
