JO Students: Making Your Start Successful

There are several things you can do to make your start successful.

1. Please read over this August newsletter and refer to our John Oliver website for information on school opening policies and procedures.
2. Pay attention to the information that will be given to you in **homeroom** the first week of school. After that week you will be expected to be familiar with the **procedures** and **rules** contained in the agenda book.
3. Grades 8 and 9 ... use your **agenda** to help you plan and organize (the book will be available after school fees have been paid). It is an invaluable tool!
4. Remember: Ask, if you need help. People at John Oliver are caring and will help you when you need it.
5. Virtue triumphs.

School Opening Schedule (please see pg. 9 for summary)

Life Skills (LS) and Learning Assistance and Life Skills (LALS) District programs.

For students in our Life Skills (LS) and Learning Assistance and Life Skills (LALS) programs your first day is Wednesday 9 September, starting at 8:30 and ending at 3:00. **Life Skills (LS) students** who are part of the VSB's bussing program should expect communication from the bus company confirming pick-up scheduling in the last week of August. The bus will drop Life Skills students off at the school's south (music wing entrance) where they will be met by our program

Support Workers. **Learning Assistance and Life Skills (LALS) students** should arrive by 8:30 and head to y/our classrooms.

Integration is an important part of every student's experience at John Oliver; during the first two weeks we will be assessing student needs and class availability to integrate students where possible.

Regular, LAC and Take a Hike students.

The 2026 – 2027 school year starts on **Tuesday, September 8th** with a homeroom period (homeroom room locations are posted in the corridor outside the admin area and in the ramp to the cafeteria: **homeroom assignments can change from year to year!**)

Grade 9-12 students: 9:30 – 10:30am. New grade 9-12 students who enrolled prior to August 29, 2026 will have had a homeroom assigned and should report directly to your homeroom, as shown on the lists in the first floor corridors.

All Grade 8 students please meet at the auditorium by 12:30 pm. They will be met by administrators, counsellors, and our LINK Crew students who will take Grade 8's to our homeroom. Grade 8's will learn how to navigate their new school environment from our homeroom teachers and through the leadership of our LINK Crew Students.

- Wednesday, September 9th from 8:40 am – 9:00 am.
Semester one schedule; period one starts at 9:05. Day ends at 1:40 pm. (Teacher collaboration and planning from 1:45-3:05)
- Thursday, September 10th from 8:40 am – 9:00 am.
Semester one schedule; period one starts at 9:05. Day ends at 3:05 pm.
- **Friday, September 11th. No homeroom; regular timetable and schedule (see p.10 and 11)!**

During mandatory homeroom periods teachers take students through important school procedures, routines, and policies. The framework that guides decision-making for all John Oliver students and staff is our school's **Code of Conduct** which is reviewed during our homeroom periods.

During the first week of school, students meet their teachers and new classmates for the semester, classroom-learning goals are established along with homework expectations.

Should you have questions for your child's teacher or grade counsellor, please contact them directly. Please take time during this important first week to review with your child a program of strong work habits at school and home that will set him or her up to maximize their educational opportunities.

Please bring your school issued lock to school. Grade 8s will be issued locks on Tuesday, September 8th.

Attendance

Prompt, regular **attendance** in class is an essential part of your child's success at school. Please continue scheduling important medical appointments, etc., outside of class time.

Attendance is taken in each class and recorded. Parents/guardians of students who are absent due to illness are asked to send an email to joattendance@vsb.bc.ca excusing their child's absence. If possible, please include you child's teachers in your email.

Make sure to add the following: **Student's full name / Student number / Date(s) and classes you were absent for / Reason for Absence**

School Calendar

John Oliver's School Calendar is on our website [available here](#): this is our active, live link and is updated as events are added!

The VSB is continuing a Flexible Instructional Time (FIT) schedule. FIT is a period of instructional time built into a school's schedule that gives students the opportunity to have choice in their learning time. Examples of using FIT time include:

- meeting with teachers for support in subject learning or completing assignments
- attending tutorial sessions
- connecting with counsellors
- collaborating with other students on projects
- individual time to study or enrichment passion projects
- completing Career Life Connections 12 and Capstone requirements
- engaging in Work Experience 11/12 activity.

Ultimately, FIT time encourages students to own their learning and gives them the opportunity to develop core competencies such as personal responsibility, self-regulation, goal setting, wellbeing and communication.

The FIT period is on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Our daily schedule, adjusted for FIT time and standardized across the district is available on page 10.

You will notice that the school day ends slightly later than in the past. This allows the introduction of monthly **collaboration time for admin and teachers** to meet and work on unit and school planning, and examine emerging best practices and growth opportunities in teaching. Collaboration activity complements our Professional Development work. Collaboration dates and times are also noted on the schedule on page 10.

School Fees

A list of school and supplemental fees is on the school website. Students will receive 'Student Account Summaries' during the first homeroom on September 8, 2026. We continue to use **School Cash Online**, to facilitate payment of school fees - we appreciate your help in significantly reducing the amount of paper our school consumes! Please register by visiting the [VSB's School Cash Online website](#). Your child's first name, last name and birth date are required for registration. Once registered, an email notification is sent when items become available for purchase online. For support, technical help or additional information, please contact the School Cash Online parent/guardian help desk by visiting helpdesk.supportschoolcashionline.com or on 1-866-961-1803.

Further information on school and supplemental fees and the online payment of those fees is also available on the school website. School Cash Online will be available for parent registration as of September 10th. School and supplemental fees will be collected through School Cash Online starting the second week of classes. Cheque or cash payments are also still accepted!

Parents, please make a note of the district's **Financial Hardship Policy** which recognizes that some families may not be able to fully afford school fees. Board policy is that no student of school age will be denied an opportunity to participate in a required course, class or program because of financial hardship. Parents/guardians unable to pay some or all of a school fee are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or administrator (Financial hardship application forms are available through the school office). All financial hardship applications and discussions shall be confidential. Ways in which difficulties in meeting requests for payment of school fees may be addressed include: partial payment, waiver of the fee, payment by instalment, and/or fundraising activities to reduce overall costs.

PAC
