SCHOOL AND DISTRICT POLICY REMINDER

Cellphone Policy:

Please note the following policy regarding cellphone use during class time:

- In class Cellphone use is only allowed under/with teacher direction
- Teachers have been provided with a Cell Phone tree/hotel for students to place their phones at the start of the period. Trees are located at the front of classrooms and away from doors.
- If a student is using their phone without teacher authorization and guidance ...
 - 1st offence: Warning
 - 2nd Offence: To Grade Admin- same day return; note kept
 - 3rd offence (and subsequent): To Grade Admin- return to parent; note kept.

Students are free to use their phones during breaks and in common spaces.
