#### School updates ...


- 1. **Report Cards.** Mid-semester report cards were printed and distributed in late April and posted online. Year-end report cards are only being published online. A primer on online portal access is provided at the end of this JO News.
- 2. New school year! Our First day back is on Tuesday 2nd September. Grade 8 students should arrive at John Oliver at 12:30 PM. Grade 9/10/11 and 12 students should arrive at 9:30AM. Students should report to home rooms to receive timetables and for attendance confirmation. Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> August school starts at 8:45 with a homeroom before we immediately move into our semester one period one classes.

**Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> and Thursday 4<sup>th</sup>** are also PM Collaboration days, so we do have a slightly earlier dismissal- at 1:45pm. For these two collaboration sessions teachers will be focusing on Provincial Ministry reporting orders and assessment of student learning, unconcious bias, and supporting student attendance.



The students visited not only the great tourist sites of Paris but also paid their respects to Canada's World War One and World War Two fallen. Students visited Vimy Ridge and were also present for the sounding of the Last Post at the Menin Gate in Ypres, Belgium, where JO students (below, from R to L) Jaime Wiley, Hugo Fugger and Elyse Flanagan-

Both Jaime and Elyse have ancestors



who gave their lives during the great battles of World War One - laying a wreath at Menin Gate and visiting their graves made the study of history and global conflict personal for them. The daily Last Post ceremony at Menin Gate has been held every evening since 1928 and pays tribute to the nearly 55,000 Commonwealth soldiers who died around Ypres. Since the First World War an increasing

number of civilians have been killed in acts of war and genocide. What would those war dead say to the soldiers committing atrocities and genocide today?
