October CSL Conferences

All JQ students will be **dismissed early at 2pm Wednesday**, **October 25 and Thursday**, **October 26** to give more time for October Communicating Student Learning (CSL) conferences.

Look for a message from your child's teacher regarding conference booking. Some teachers may choose to spread their conferences out over more than the two early dismissal days.

October conferences are an informal learning update prior to Written Learning Update #1 which will be sent home December 1. Conferences are an opportunity for students, families and teachers to consider 3 questions about students' learning:

- 1. Where am I now?
- 2. Where am I going?
- 3. How do I get there?

Resource teachers may join conferences for students they support. Prep teachers will also be available to meet with students and families.

Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA)



In the coming weeks, students in grades 4 and 7 will participate in the Foundational Skills Assessments (FSA). These assessments focus on students' literacy and numeracy development. As mentioned earlier this week in a message from our superintendent to families of students in grades 4 and 7, the FSAs provide valuable information about how students in Vancouver schools are doing. Individual classroom teachers can use assessment results as one measure of how students in their classrooms are doing and where they need more support. As a school district, FSA results are used to help make evidence-informed decisions about where we need to focus resources and supports to enhance student learning.

Respiratory illnesses are beginning to circulate within the community. The latest guidance from Vancouver Coastal Health is:

Students who are exhibiting symptoms of illness, including respiratory and gastrointestinal illness, should stay home until they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Those who are vomiting or have diarrhea should be symptom-free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

If a member of the household is sick, children can continue to attend school and masking is not required.

School staff will continue to encourage regular hand washing. Masks are available in the school office should a student wish to request one at any time.

Dress for cold and rainy weather



School Fees 2023-2024

School Grounds and Student Pick up/Drop off



Please note that the front playground will be supervised from 8:40 to 9:00 am and from 3:03 to 3:18 pm. At the beginning of each day (9:00 am), classroom teachers will meet students at a designated spot and escort them into the school. At the end of the day (3:03 pm), students will return to the same spot for pick-up by parents. Students not picked up by 3:18 pm will be taken to the office and a parent contacted. Thank you for picking up your child promptly at dismissal.

At this time we continue to ask that after pick up/drop off, parents remain off school grounds until 3:18 pm as this allows for easier identification of students who have not yet been picked up by a parent or guardian.

When waiting to pick children up at the end of the school day, parents and caregivers are asked not to crowd around the main entrance to the schoolyard off Crown Street, but to spread out along the sidewalk outside the fence.



Please Note that there have been safety concerns regarding cars and traffic on 14th and Crown street. Students, families and staff are encouraged to consider active modes of transportation for getting to and from school. There is only limited parking around JQ. Families can also consider parking a few blocks away from the school and walking with their child to the entrance.

Distraction-free Learning



To help maintain a distraction-free, safe and caring learning environment, JQ families are asked not to send children to school with cell phones or other electronic devices.

During the school day, and any time students are in the care of school staff, including field trips and before and after school extracurricular activities, communication between students and families must go through the office or the staff member in charge.

Any electronic device used by students during the school day, including before and after school, recess and lunch, and during field trips and extracurricular activities may only be with teacher or staff permission and direct supervision.

Families that choose to send children to school with a cell phone or other electronic device in case of emergencies during the trip to and from school must ensure their child understands the phone or device may only be used at school with teacher or staff permission and direct supervision. Any personal electronic devices students bring to school must be turned off or put on silent mode and stored in their school bag for the duration of the school day, including before and after school, and during any school sponsored activities.

Students unable to abide by the policy described above will have the phone or device confiscated and turned in to the office. A parent or guardian will be asked to come retrieve the phone or device and be reminded of the policy.

Thank you for helping to ensure a distraction-free, safe and caring learning environment for our students and staff.

Allergy aware school





We ask that families avoid including foods that contain potentially life-threatening allergens such as nuts and nut products in lunches or snacks.

All VSB schools are also Air Aware, meaning students, staff and visitors are encouraged to use fragrance free and unscented shampoos, hairsprays, deodorants, lotions, and other products, and avoiding application of perfume and cologne.

TO ORDER: Log in to munchalunch.com if you already have an account from last year. You will be asked to update your child(ren)'s class/division prior to placing your first order.

If you do not have an account yet, go to munchalunch.com/schools/julesquesnel to register and start ordering.

Hot Lunch days are Tuesdays and Thursdays this year. Pizza Days will be on Fridays.

For your convenience, the new ordering deadline for Hot Lunch and Pizza Day is the day before at 8 am. You may place orders for as many hot lunch and pizza dates as you like at one time.

After you place an order, please ensure that you have received an email from MunchaLunch confirming your order dates and food items. Please ensure that you also receive a separate email with your credit card payment receipt.

If your child is away on a Hot Lunch or Pizza Day AFTER THE 'ORDER BY DATE', you may pick up their lunch at the school between 11:30 and 12 pm. For food safety reasons, lunches will not be kept after this time. There will be no refunds after the 'order by' date.

If a class trip comes up on a Hot Lunch or Pizza Day and you have already placed an order for that day and would like to cancel, you can notify the Hot Lunch Coordinator at jqgradeseven2024@gmail.com for a credit BEFORE THE 'ORDER BY' DATE. 
