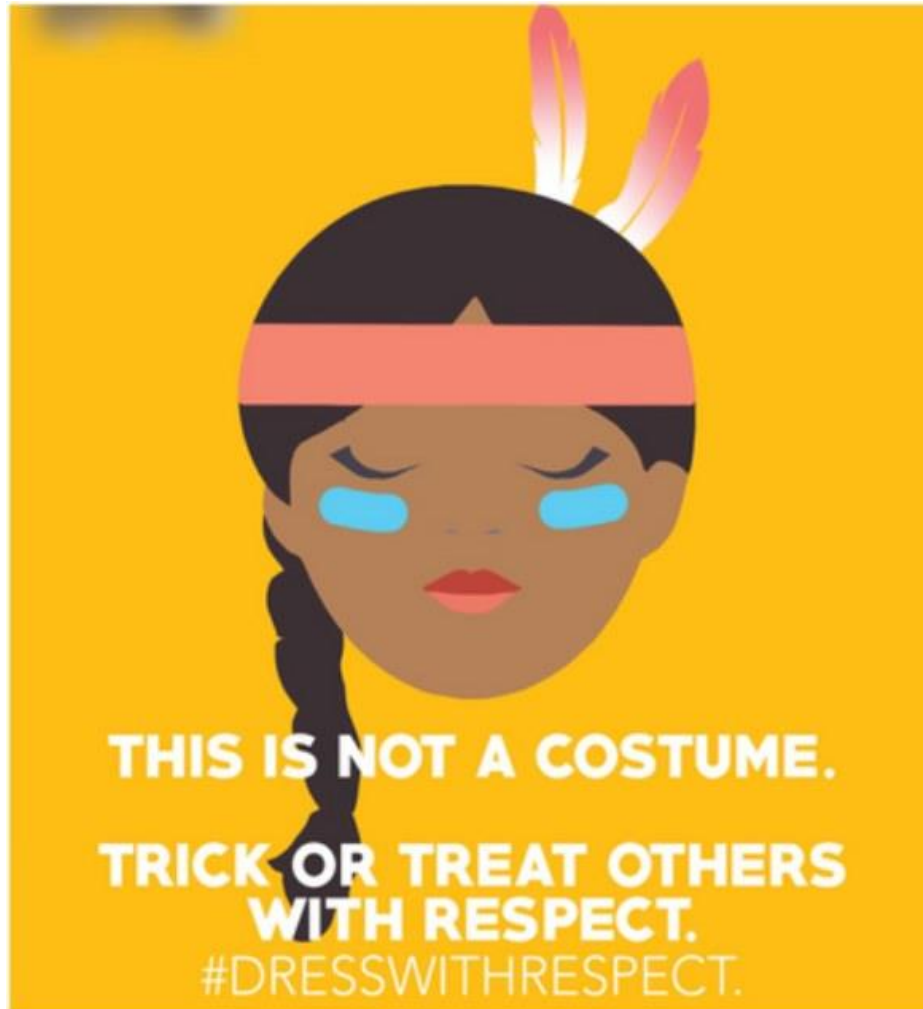

## Choosing appropriate Halloween costumes



A few reminders:

- Masks that obstruct the wearer's vision or conceal the wearer's eyes are not permitted at school.
- As stated in the Vancouver School District Code of Conduct: Students shall not possess or use any weapon, replica, or toy weapon on any school premises or activity organized or sponsored by a school. Please do not send children to school with Halloween costumes that include weapons.
- At school, costumes that are creative and whimsical as opposed to scary and gory are preferred. Keep the blood, and scary items for Halloween night celebrations at home, please.
- Please keep and consume Halloween candies **at home**. Students are encouraged to continue to bring a healthy snack and lunch to school.

**How not to culturally appropriate Halloween**

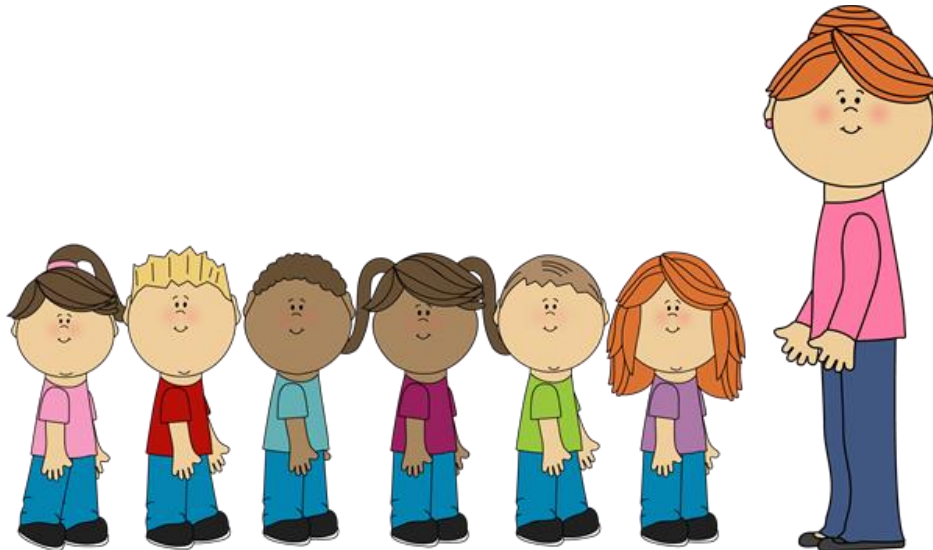

## Adjustments to student Drop off and Pick up locations



To reduce congestion in front of the school at the beginning and end of the day, some divisions' drop off / pick up locations have been changed. Please refer to the Drop off / Pick up Locations Map below to see the changes. The white arrows on the map show the openings in the fence students will use to enter and exit school grounds. Please wait by the specified entrances to help spread families out along the sidewalks.



Please note that the front playground is supervised from 8:40 to 9:00 am and from 3:03 to 3:18 pm. At the beginning of each day (9:00 am), classroom teachers will meet students at their drop off / pick up location and escort them into the school. At the end of the day (3:03 pm), students will return to the same location for pick-up by parents. Students not picked up by 3:18 pm will be taken to the office and a parent contacted. Thank you for picking up your child promptly at dismissal.

We continue to ask that after drop-off / pick up, parents remain off school grounds as this allows for easier identification of students and staff. After school, after 3:18 pm, when students who haven't been picked up have been gathered to the office, families are welcome to come onto school grounds.

## Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA)



In the coming weeks, students in grades 4 and 7 will participate in the Foundational Skills Assessments (FSA). These assessments focus on students' literacy and numeracy development. As mentioned earlier this week in a message from our superintendent to families of students in grades 4 and 7, the FSAs provide valuable information about how students in Vancouver schools are doing. Individual classroom teachers can use assessment results as one measure of how students in their classrooms are doing and where they need more support. As a school district, FSA results are used to help make evidence-informed decisions about where we need to focus resources and supports to enhance student learning.

## Coughs and Colds

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Respiratory illnesses are beginning to circulate within the community. The latest guidance from Vancouver Coastal Health is:

Students who are exhibiting symptoms of illness, including respiratory and gastrointestinal illness, should stay home until they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Those who are vomiting or have diarrhea should be symptom-free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

If a member of the household is sick, children can continue to attend school and masking is not required.

School staff will continue to encourage regular hand washing. Masks are available in the school office should a student wish to request one at any time.

## Dress for cold and rainy weather



The rainy season has arrived. Please make sure that your child has appropriate weather to play outside during recess and lunch. It is also suggested that students have a spare set of clothing in the classroom in case of falls/accidents during outdoors time.

The clinic will take place on **Tuesday, November 7th** for grade 6 students. Consent forms have been sent home to parents, please return by the end of next week for collection by Emilia Cortese, our Public Health Nurse. Thank you.

## School Parking Lot

A reminder that the parking lot is for school staff and Byng pool staff only between the hours of 07:45 am and 3:30 pm. It should not be used for pick-up and drop off of students during these hours. For everyone's safety, we ask families to walk around the lot, rather than across the middle of the lot during drop-off and pick-up. Walking around is the safest option and reinforces our message to students when they head outside for recess. Thank you for keeping our students' safety at heart.

## School Fees 2023-2024



Thank you to all families who have paid school fees. The fees are now due to the Vancouver School Board. If you have not yet had the opportunity to do so, the fees can be paid in the following ways:

## Distraction-free Learning



To help maintain a distraction-free, safe and caring learning environment, JQ families are asked not to send children to school with cell phones or other electronic devices.

During the school day, and any time students are in the care of school staff, including field trips and before and after school extracurricular activities, communication between students and families must go through the office or the staff member in charge.

Any electronic device used by students during the school day, including before and after school, recess and lunch, and during field trips and extracurricular activities may only be with teacher or staff permission and direct supervision.

Families that choose to send children to school with a cell phone or other electronic device in case of emergencies during the trip to and from school must ensure their child understands the phone or device may only be used at school with teacher or staff permission and direct supervision. Any personal electronic devices students bring to school must be turned off or put on silent mode and stored in their school bag for the duration of the school day, including before and after school, and during any school sponsored activities.

Students unable to abide by the policy described above will have the phone or device confiscated and turned in to the office. A parent or guardian will be asked to come retrieve the phone or device and be reminded of the policy.

# TIPS FOR SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S FRENCH EDUCATION

Most French immersion parents have either a limited knowledge of French or cannot speak the language at all. If you don't speak French yourself, it is not suggested you read to your child in French now. However, any reading that you do in your first language is recommended and the reading skills that are learned, such as vocabulary development and reading from left to right, can be transferred to French.

Being able to read words and sound out letters are important aspects of learning to read but true reading involves reading for meaning and making connections with our own personal experiences. Children should be encouraged to clarify what they read through pictures, questions and discussion and retelling the story. This leads to greater understanding and comprehension.

## At home for the primary children, here are some simple suggestions:

- Be enthusiastic and positive.
- Read often to your child in English (or your first language).
- Provide French resources eg. French dictionaries, DVDs, CDs, books, comic books.
- Consider putting them into a French language summer day camp.
- Discover French internet web sites.
- Join the local chapter of your Canadian Parents for French to network with other immersion parents, access services and to keep informed about developments in French second language education.
- Sign up for an adult French course geared to French immersion parents.
- Listen to French radio and watch French shows or movies.
- Hire a tutor or babysitter who speaks French to play with your child.

Try to develop the best relationship possible between you and your child's French immersion teacher, making teamwork the main theme. Asking about your children's homework and praising them for its completion as well as allowing them to tell you about their day will help create a more positive environment about school in general.

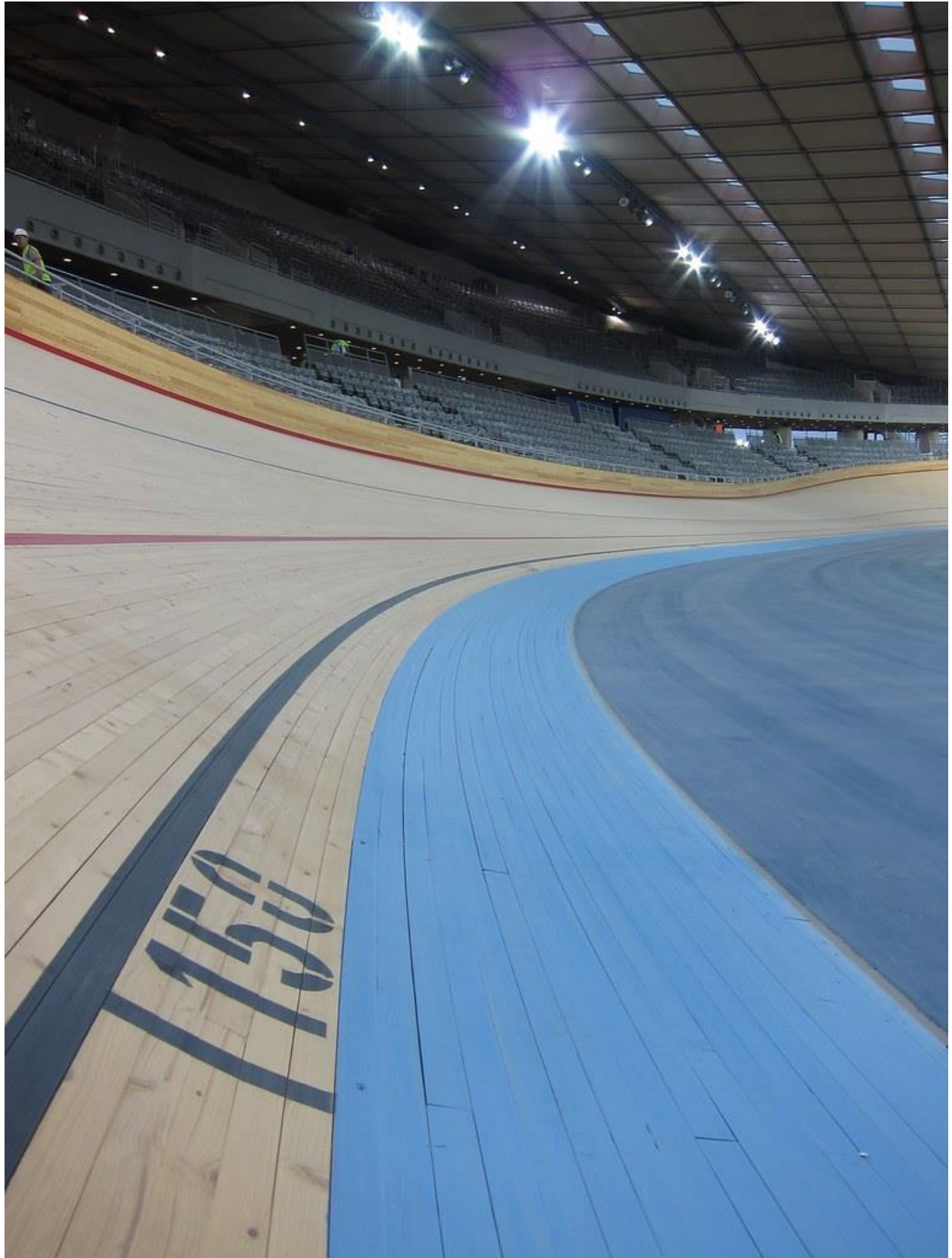
