





#### **CONTEMPORARY ART PROJECT**

Division 2 has been working on a year long project called A New Path to the Waterfall. This project situated a satellite gallery of the Contemporary Art Gallery within our classroom. Developed through collaboration with Portland artist Harrell Fletcher and the CAG, the project places local artists in Division 2's grade 6/7 classroom throughout the 2017-18 school year, reshaping the ways in which we consider contemporary art, gallery spaces and public schools.



In a series of participatory projects reflecting Fletcher's interest in bringing art and life together, local artists Justine A. Chambers, Elisa Ferrari, Hannah Jickling, Carmen Papalia, Helen Reed and T'uy't'tanat-Cease Wyss have been collaborating with the students to create projects and interventions exploring different issues and investigating a variety of topics connected to the grade 6/7 curriculum. Each artist's tenure has been presented to the public through exhibitions, interventions, performances and public programming at six week intervals throughout the school year. Our final performance will take place June 14 at 5:30 pm in room C203. All are welcome.

A New Path to the Waterfall is generously supported by the Vancouver Park Board, the City of Vancouver, The Vancouver Foundation, TELUS Community Board, the Hamber Foundation and Artstarts/Artists in the Classroom.

#### **CLASS PLACEMENT 2018-2019**

In deciding the placement of students in classes, staff members consider student groupings which balance academic and social needs. Student learning styles and relationships are also part of the process. Parent/guardian input can also be very helpful to our process. Our objective is to create classes which best meet the needs of our students.

#### **SOLUTION ROOM**

Solution Room is a lunch-hour service available to students through self-referral or teacher referral. Its aim is to help students solve playground issues/conflicts as they happen. It is located at the Safe Arrival Room across from the office and is open every lunch hour. The staff member on duty will be available to guide students through the process of appropriate expression of feelings, identifying problems, examining their role in the conflict, formulating safe and respectful solutions. Through this guided process, it is hoped that students will gain skills to handle conflicts in a more empathetic and compassion manner. #### 2018-19 GENERAL SCHOOL FEES

The 2017-18 School Fees notice sent home in May of last year stated that this school year would be the final year that school supplies would be purchased for a set fee by the school district and that starting in September 2018, parents would need to purchase items on their own.

# Please note that the general school supplies fee will still be charged for the upcoming 2018-19 school year.

The Vancouver School Board will continue its service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2018-2019 will remain at \$25.00 per student. This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

We are very fortunate to be the first School in Vancouver to have a Story Studio learning space. We have been working with Ging Wong, our District Literacy Teacher, in organizing a space in our school to support children in finding, creating, building, drawing and writing stories. The Pop-Up Story Studio concept was inspired by Opal School in Portland, Grauer Elementary in Richmond and Annieville Elementary in Delta. The Story Studio is full of art materials, Indigenous materials, loose parts, natural materials, story mats and picture books. The students are invited to use a variety of materials to provoke their sense of wonder, imagination, thinking and respond by creating stories. It has been an amazing and inspiring experience for all of the students who have used the space. Stories have been created in English and French from students in Kindergarten to Grade 7. We are happy to have the opportunity to continue with the Studio in September 2018!
