On May 24th we all became aware that the remains of 215 children were found at the Kamloops Indian Residential School site on the Tk'emlups te Secwépmc Nation.

This week the revelation of this national tragedy brought us together in deep sadness for and acknowledgment of the 215 children whose remains have been found, and in support for those in the Indigenous Education Department, intergenerational survivors and community members impacted by the devastating news and the lasting impact of the residential school system. We wore orange to express our solidarity. Flags were lowered to acknowledge and pay respect.

Song and singing are very important to Indigenous Communities. 'As we have been taught, 'the more we sing, the more we heal'. On June 9th, 215 hours will have passed, and we invite you to sing with us:
