Admin Team Message

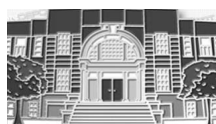

We are currently working on our preliminary students enrollment numbers for next school year. If you know that your child currently enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 6 will NOT be returning to Tennyson for the 2019/2020 school year, please let the office know ASAP. We thank you for your assistance with this.

School Cash Online – Please Sign Up!

Tennyson is looking to go live with School Cash Online (an electronic payment system) for September 2019. This means that families will need to create an account this year to be part of the program. The School Cash Online program will allow you to pay for school fees, field trips, and some other school expenses online (as opposed to sending in cash or cheques). **As of today, 51% of Tennyson families have signed up. Our goal is to have 100% signed up by September.** Here is an electronic link as well:

September 2019 Information

Please see attached to this newsletter the 2019-2020 Tennyson Calendar which shows all of our Professional Development Days, Early Dismissals, and Instructional Days. Also attached is our 2019-2020 School Fee letter. You will receive a package in September with instructions about payment. We share the fee information with parents now to give you advance notice (these were also contained in a previous email to all families, and are on our school website in the *Publications* section).



The first day of school is September 3rd, 2019. **As in previous years, VSB elementary schools are in session from 9am to 10am only.** This allows us to get a sense of our enrollment, and we then engage in professional meetings. September 4th onwards, school sessions will be regular hours. Students will go to their “last year’s class” (the same physical classroom as this year), and will likely be there for several days while we work on our enrollment, as it generally shifts between now and the first week of September. Students new to Tennyson will meet in the library. We will have signage, and will send an information bulletin to all families prior to school start.

For students coming into Kindergarten, families will be receiving the gradual entry schedule. Our Kindergarten team is currently putting together the gradual entry schedule for September, which will be emailed to parents next week.

Marché pour Aider (Market to Help Others)

The Grade 4 students of Divisions 7 and 8 recently planned and implemented a two-day outdoor market in which school and community members were invited to buy crafts and gently used items. The students, under the leadership of Mme Emilie, Mme Kulokas and Mme

Tennyson 2020 – Construction Updates & New Site

Our construction crew is currently working on the second floor, has poured the concrete floor, and is currently working on the second floor walls. Our anticipated move-in date is approximately sometime in May, 2020, but of course we will need to be flexible depending on progress. The district has many schools who have moved to a new site mid-year, and will assist us with this process. More info to come! A big thank you to our Tennyson 2020 committee and in particular parents Katherine and Tara who have worked tirelessly to research playground options, working with the playground company, the district, and with our own school staff. It will be exciting to finish consultation with students, families, and staff in the fall, and to announce what our finalized large playground will look like. The small playground that was previously next to the yellow portable will also be re-installed on the north-west corner of the site.

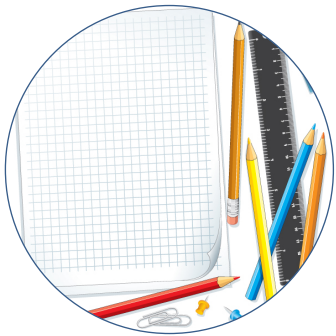

GENERAL \$35.00 SUPPLY FEE



The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2019 – 2020 is \$35.00 per student*.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

*The General Supply Fee of \$35 is an increase to the fee from previous years and reflects increases in current costs.

SUPPLEMENTARY FEES

Student Agenda/Planner – \$5 (where applicable)

Students at Tennyson will be using an Agenda/Planner in grades K-7. School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families. Some primary divisions will be creating a customized planner; those teachers will communicate the format and fee to you (it will not exceed \$5).

Activity Fee (Gr 7 Quebec Exchange) – \$450 (where applicable)

This year, we will be engaging in the Quebec exchange for students in Grade 7. Parent support for this activity was confirmed last school year and we appreciate your contribution towards this opportunity. The \$450 fee is the amount charged should parents volunteer with the Quebec fundraising.

Field Studies – To be determined throughout the school year at the classroom level

Throughout the school year your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

As a reminder, the Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school Principal or Vice Principal. All requests will be treated confidentially.



Dear Tennyson Families,

The Vancouver School Board will soon be offering School Cash Online at **Lord Tennyson Elementary** as its method of payment for all school related fees, including field trips, all September fees and library lost books payments. This secure system helps parents/guardians and community members pay school-related fees safely, quickly and easily online.

The new system puts all of the school fees available to your student online for purchase, keeping you informed of your child's activities and needs. We will post items through the system and assign the relevant fees to your student. You can then choose to purchase these fees online with one of three different methods, including credit cards. You can also stay informed and keep track of which school fees require your attention. The system strictly adheres to Canada's privacy and anti-spam legislation and meets the latest industry standards for payment security.

We want to take this opportunity to encourage all parents to register by **Friday May 17th, 2019**. We will then pilot the system with several divisions and we will aim for full implementation effective September 3rd, 2019. We will let you know if your child's division will be on the initial pilot.

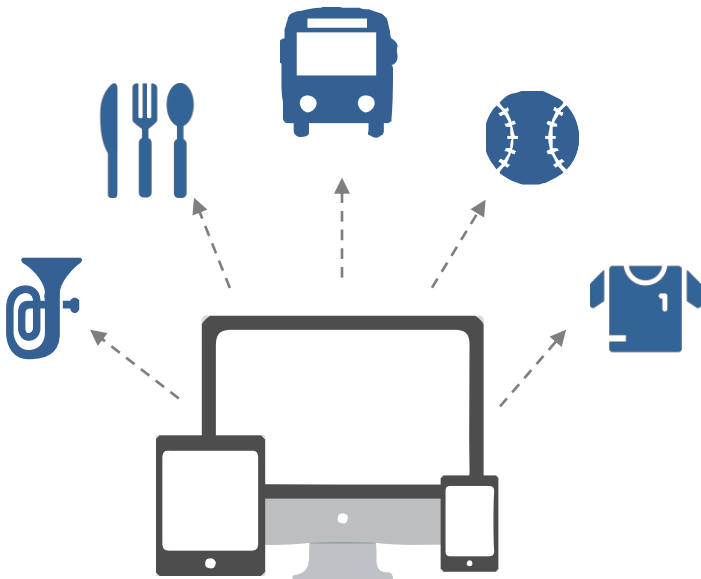
Welcome to *School Cash Online*

School Cash Online is an online parent portal that offers a safe, fast and convenient way to pay for school activity fees. The portal is customized to meet your school's needs and allows you as a parent, to add your students, make payments, check current balance/account history, print or view receipts, and receive notifications about upcoming events.

Why Use School Cash Online?

With School Cash Online, you can pay all your student's school fees with the click of a button. Wherever. Whenever. Trips to the school to drop-off cash or sending your student with money will be a thing of the past. School Cash Online also enables you to keep track of your student's school items and activities.

Purchase these items and more online.



Credit Card

Pay with Visa or MasterCard on School Cash Online by entering your credit card number, CVV number (the three digits on the back of your card), card expiry date, and billing information.



eCheck

An electronic version of a paper check used to make payments online. Anyone with a checking or savings account can pay by eCheck through School Cash Online.



myWallet

An online wallet that can be loaded to hold funds and pay for your child's fees on School Cash Online. myWallet also allows you to allocate funds to pay for school fees at a later date, as you would with a gift card.

Click "Add Student" and fill in the required fields with your child's details.

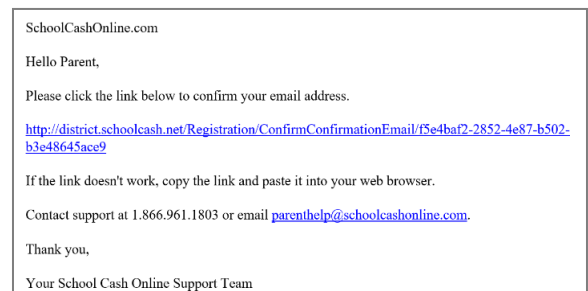
Step 1: Register

- If you have not registered, please go to the *School Cash Online* home page <https://vsb.schoolcashonline.com> and select the "Get Started Today" option.
- Complete each of the three Registration Steps
*For Security Reasons your password, requires 8 characters, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.



Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and *School Cash Online* account. The confirmation link will open the *School Cash Online* site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.



Step 3: Find Student

This step will connect your children to your account.

- Enter the School Board Name.
- Enter the School Name.
- Enter Your Child's Usual First Name, Last Name and Birth Date.
- Select *Continue*.
- On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select *Continue*.
- Your child has been added to your account.
