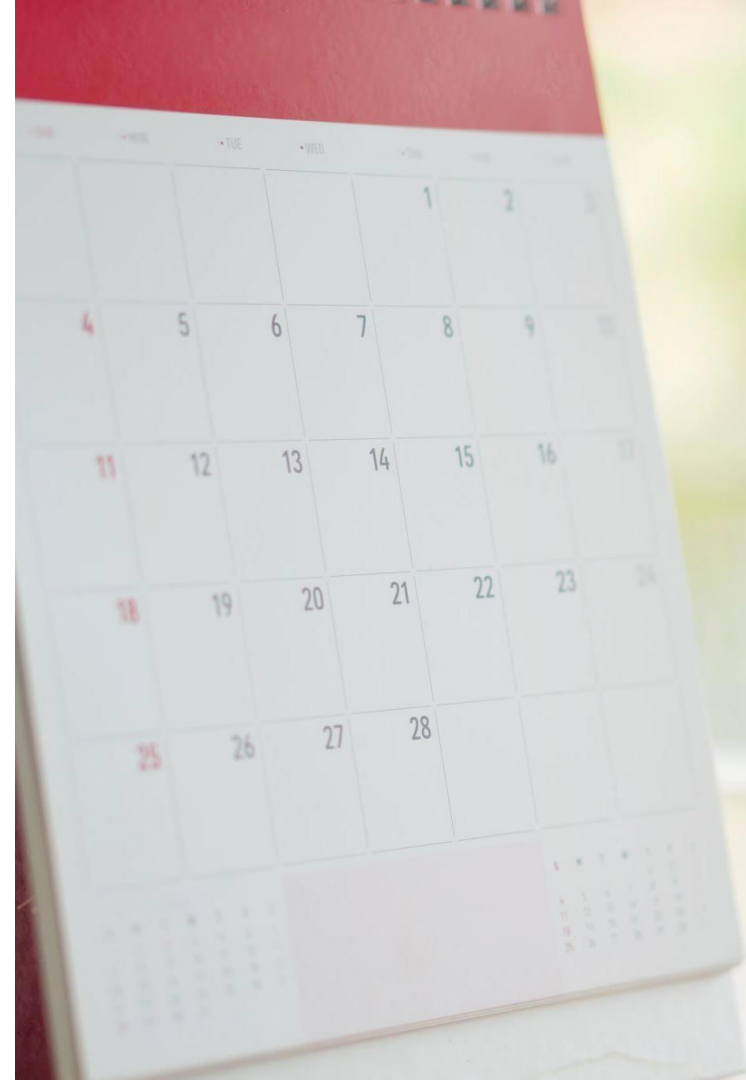


Schools are staffed and time-tabled according to the information in MyEd

BLUE boxes are courses for students in the MAIN SCHOOL.

GREEN boxes are courses open to ALL Gr 11 & 12 students, in the MAIN SCHOOL and in BYNG ARTS.

ORANGE font courses are in the English First Peoples stream. Any one of these courses will fulfill the Indigenous-focused graduation requirement.

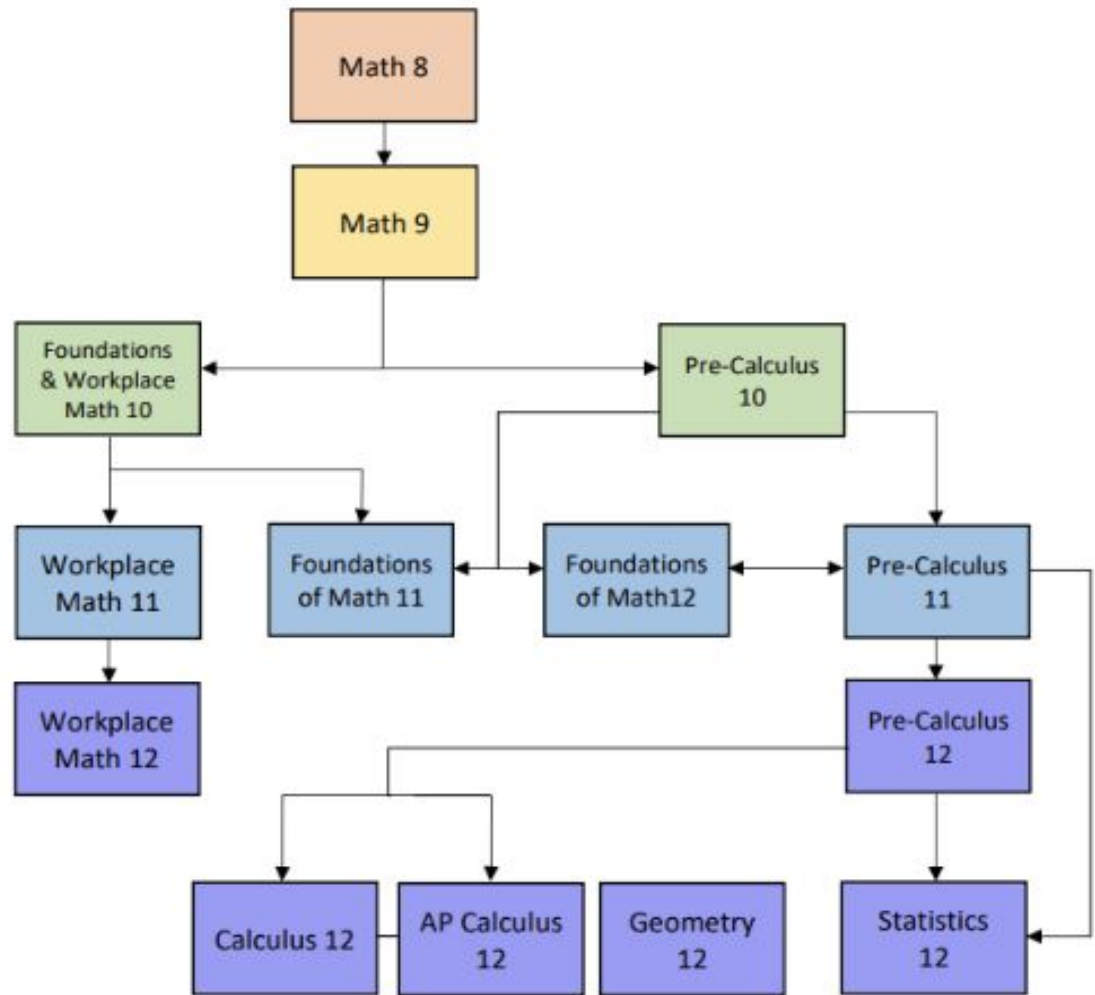
Senior English ELECTIVES

- Open to ALL students in Grades 11 & 12, both Main School and Byng Arts.
- Teacher permission is NOT required.
- CANNOT be used to replace a Grade 11 or Grade 12 Language Arts graduation requirement (e.g., English Studies 12).
- Literary Studies 12: British Literature counts as an approved academic course for university admission.
- Creative Writing 12 is accepted by some universities as an academic course.
- If these courses are oversubscribed, priority goes to Grade 12s. Students in the Main School and in Byng Arts will get equity of access.

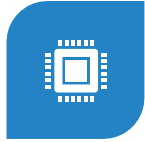

COURSE SELECTION

Students will enter their course choices at home using MyEd. Instructions on how to do this are on the Lord Byng Website.

Students will have access to the MyEd portal until February 19th

Student Online Course Selection

1. Click on My Info Top Tab
2. Click on Requests Side Tab
3. Click on "Entry mode>>" if you see it
4. Read and follow the instructions for the grade you are entering into
5. Click the "Select" button to see options of courses in that subject area

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6. Read and follow the instructions
7. Select course(s) by clicking on the checkbox
8. Click the "OK" button when done
9. You may have a drop-down menu to select more pages of course options
10. For elective course you can choose up to 2 alternate courses
11. Use the scroll bar to the right to see the Alternate columns
12. Use the drop-down to select alternate courses
13. Click the "OK" button when done
14. All your primary requests will be displayed when done
15. Enter notes that your counselor can reference when you meet about your course selections
16. Click the "Post" button
17. You will see confirmation box that you posted successfully

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HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD CHOOSE THEIR COURSES

- Be aware of your own mindset and experiences
- Secondary school is a time of discovery and exploration
- Consider what students are good at, like to learn about, and want to try
- Can think about post secondary options but keep in mind institutions have different admission requirements and those requirements can change
- University requirements are different from high school graduation requirements

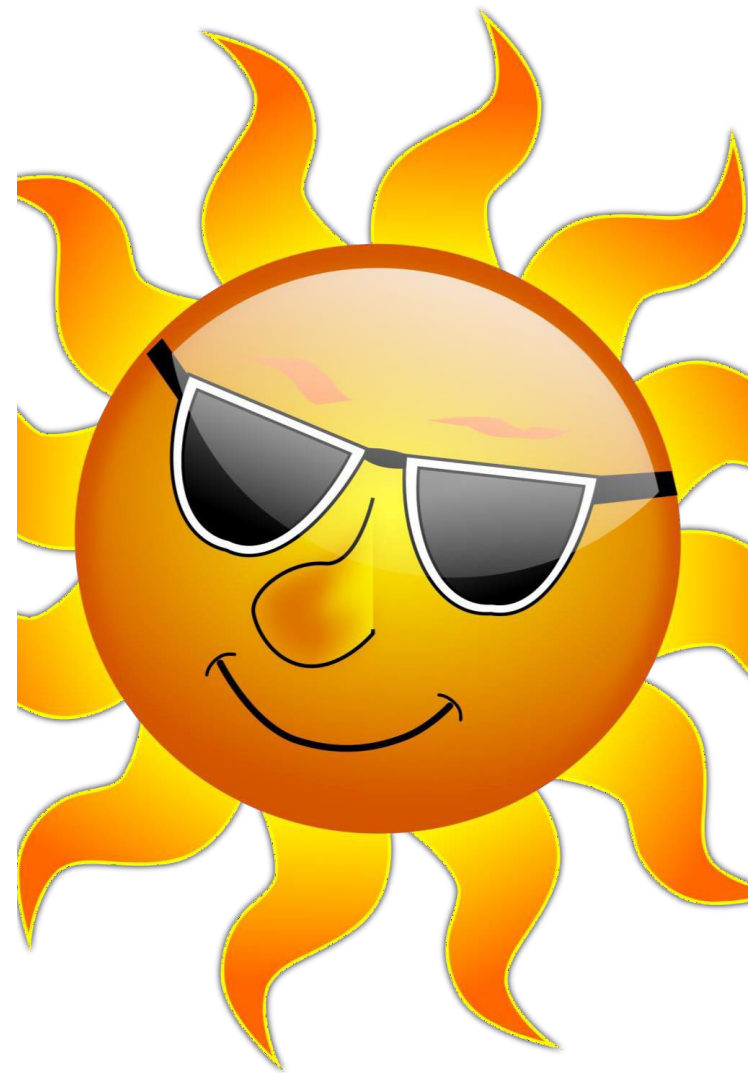
