


Senior English ELECTIVES

- Open to ALL students in Grades 11 & 12, both Main School and Byng Arts.
- Teacher permission is NOT required.
- CANNOT be used to replace a Grade 11 or Grade 12 Language Arts graduation requirement (e.g., English Studies 12).
- Literary Studies 12: British Literature counts as an approved academic course for university admission.
- Creative Writing 12 is accepted by some universities as an academic course.
- If these courses are oversubscribed, priority goes to Grade 12s. Students in the Main School and in Byng Arts will get equity of access.





How Parents Can Help

- Ask open-ended questions (“What did you enjoy?”)
- Focus on effort, not on grades alone
- Encourage balance (academics and electives)
- Normalize struggle as part of learning
- Remember that secondary school is a time of discovery and exploration



What is not so helpful.....

- Comparing your child to siblings, peers or yourself
- Over-focusing on future careers
- Making decisions for the student
- Treating one year or one class as “make or break”
- Overly focusing on weaknesses rather than a child’s strengths


