Dear Laurier Community,

- 6) Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life
- 7) Knows that you expect him/her to succeed in school

Please consider joining the many events that will be organized in our school throughout the school year and volunteer in your child's classroom. You will receive a newsletter on a monthly basis *via* email. Please read the information provided, and If you have any questions about the rules and expectations or any other school-related activities, please feel free to contact me or to discuss them with your child's teacher. Late Returning Students

The school should be informed if a student currently enrolled in a Vancouver school plans to return to their Neighbourhood School later than Tuesday, Sept. 4, 2018 but prior to Sept. 28th. The deadline for withdrawing no show students is Friday, September 7th at noon, unless the family has made arrangements with the school for a late return of their child(ren). If the parent or legal guardian did not complete the Notice of Late Return Form last June, they are asked to complete the form provided on our school website and return it to school by the Friday deadline. All student attendance must be verified by noon Friday, Sept. 7, 2018, otherwise spaces may be filled with other students on waitlists.

Again, please let us know as soon as possible, preferably by the first day of school but no later than Friday, Sept. 7, 2018 at noon, if the above applies to your child. If you are not returning in September please let the Office know immediately as this may affect class size and composition for the next school year.

Class Placement Criteria

Our staff know their students best in the school context and engage in a rigorous class placement process. Each placement decision is approached carefully and collaboratively and reviewed many times by considering each student's social, emotional and academic needs. In addition to these considerations, staff discuss the following criteria to optimize learning for each student and harmonize the class dynamic:

- Balance of academic, social and emotional abilities
- Social connections
- Students as English Language Learners
- Students with special needs
- Leadership abilities
- Cohesive student groupings
- Previous classroom history/ family history
- Class size composition (Ministry/ VBE)

Students' New Divisions

The move to students' new divisions is an exciting time. Parents can help make this part of their child's "Back to School" experience a positive one!

- When children move to their new division, some students may react emotionally (in keeping with a child's maturity level).
- Children often look to their parents for their reaction as well, learning from them. Parents can help by encouraging their child to be open and accepting and by highlighting the positive aspects of the new class, like new friends, new teacher, etc. Your child will be looking for your reaction; be positive and optimistic. S/he may not have all the same friends as last year, so talk about the opportunities to make new friends or be reconnected with old ones. Later moves among divisions often create a "domino-effect" of new issues and requests to change divisions are not possible.
- Your child may be in a combined class (often referred to as "split"). There are often misunderstandings and misconceptions about multi-grade classes, and parents may not be aware of the many advantages to multi-grade classes. Reporting Student Absences:

If your child will be absent from school, please call **604-713-5159** to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message at the dedicated answering service by calling the number provided. You will be prompted to provide the two-digit extension for your child's school to access the school's voicemail box for reporting an absence. The two-digit extension for Laurier Elementary is **44**.

It is important to report your child's absence prior to 9:00 a.m. on the first day of the absence.

If your child is late for school they must sign in at the office before they make their way to the classroom. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine.

Student Sign Out Procedure:

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child, they will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child and we are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department. Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. Thank you for helping us keep your child safe!
