

Late Returning Students

The school should be informed if a student currently enrolled in a Vancouver school plans to return to their Neighbourhood School later than Tuesday, Sept. 3, 2019 but prior to Sept. 27th. Please note: If the school cannot verify your child's attendance at school by noon on Wednesday, September 4th, your child's space will be given to another student on the school's waitlist. Laurier Code of Conduct

(Please review this code with your child regularly.)

At Sir Wilfrid Laurier we encourage all student to S.O.A.R. with success. (Supportive - Open Minded - Awesome - Respectful)

Purpose:

Laurier's Code of Conduct has been created to help maintain a safe, caring and orderly school environment. The Purpose of the Code of Conduct is:

- 1. To encourage the development of socially responsible behaviour resulting in a positive reputation for students and the school community.
- 2. To foster a safe, respectful and welcoming learning environment for all students, staff and parents.
- 3. To clearly communicate behavioural expectations to the school community.

The Code of Conduct applies to all members of the school community at school, traveling to and from the school, at any school-related activity at any location, or any circumstance/activity that will have an impact on the school environment. At Sir Wilfrid Laurier Elementary School we believe that character development through the proactive teaching of positive social skills is paramount to the success of any student.

At Laurier the staff have adopted a School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (S.W.P.B.S) approach to supporting behaviour. The staff explicitly teach and model what it means to S.O.A.R in all locations in the school and at home.

Supportive means:

- we welcome everyone
- we include others
- we are helpful
- we are kind

Open Minded means:

- we are flexible
- we try new things
- we make new friends
- we are brave

Awesome means:

- we try our best
- we are cool (we know how to self-regulate)
- we have fun
- we are proud to be ourselves

Respectful means:

- we respect ourselves
- we respect others
- we respect the environment
- · we respect our school

Minor Misbehavior:

- staff member will speak directly to the student to review appropriate behaviour
- the student will be reminded of the school Code of Conduct and prompted to identify his or her breach of the Code. The expectation will be retaught, role-modeled and positively reinforced.

Serious or Repeated Misbehavior:

- reported to teacher/principal
- discussion and reflection with the student, reminding student of our Code of Conduct
- alternative choices the student could have made
- record of the incident and action taken
- parents will be contacted to review the Code of Conduct with their child
- may include loss of privileges (playground, classroom or school privileges)
- may include some type of restorative justice

Very Serious Misbehaviour:

- reflection on past behaviour
- · discussion with staff involved
- parents contacted
- officials or other agencies contacted as needed
- School Board Officials, the Police, MCFD or other community agencies may be contacted if deemed necessary.

Unacceptable Conduct:

The following are examples of conduct that must be reported as soon as possible to a staff member or supervising adult:

- Bullying, harassment, intimidation or exclusion
- interfering with an orderly environment
- interfering with the learning of others

Class Placement Criteria

Our staff know their students best in the school context and engage in a rigorous class placement process. Each placement decision is approached carefully and collaboratively and reviewed many times by considering each student's social, emotional and academic needs. In addition to these considerations, staff discuss the following criteria to optimize learning for each student and harmonize the class dynamic:

- Balance of academic, social and emotional abilities
- Social connections
- Students as English Language Learners
- Students with special needs
- Leadership abilities
- Cohesive student groupings
- Previous classroom history/ family history
- Class size composition (Ministry/ VBE)



Student Placement 2019-2020

We will be unsure of the exact placement of students until the children are all counted on the first few days in September. The Laurier team will be finalizing the class lists based on the new enrollment and the class size and composition requirements. We hope this process can be completed by the end of the first week of school and we will inform your children about their new classes on Friday afternoon or Monday morning. Students' New Divisions

The move to students' new divisions is an exciting time. Parents can help make this part of their child's "Back to School" experience a positive one!

- When children move to their new division, some students may react emotionally (in keeping with a child's maturity level).
- Children often look to their parents for their reaction as well, learning from them. Parents can help by encouraging their child to be open and accepting and by highlighting the positive aspects of the new class, like new friends, new teacher, etc. Your child will be looking for your reaction; be positive and optimistic. They may not have all the same friends as last year, so talk about the opportunities to make new friends or be reconnected with old ones. Later moves among divisions often create a "domino-effect" of new issues and requests to change divisions are not possible.
- Your child may be in a combined class (often referred to as "split"). There are often misunderstandings and misconceptions about multi-grade classes, and parents may not be aware of the many advantages to multi-grade classes. Reporting Student Absences:

If your child will be absent from school, please call **604-713-5159** to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message at the dedicated answering service by calling the number provided. You will be prompted to provide the two-digit extension for your child's school to access the school's voicemail box for reporting an absence. The two-digit extension for Laurier Elementary is **44**.

It is important to report your child's absence prior to 9:00 a.m. on the first day of the absence.

If your child is late for school, they must sign in at the office before they make their way to the classroom. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine.

Student Sign Out Procedure:

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child, they will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child and we are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department. Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. Thank you for helping us keep your child safe!
