Beginning this bridge building project is Indigenous artist and educator Mr. Dave Robinson

who travelled to the elementary school to present a cedar bench to the school on behalf of the Byng community. The bench had previously been gifted to Byng Secondary School in a potlatch ceremony held at

the school in the Fall of 2020. The bench was regifted as a sign of friendship and relationship building by Byng and marks the start of a new relationship being built between the two schools.

#### **Peers Provide Feedback on English Book Reports**


With week one beginning in the Spring Term, students in Ms. Zhu's English class wasted no time in getting started with class presentations of their book reports,




