February is <u>Black History Month</u> and an opportunity for us to acknowledge and support our students of Black ancestry as well as to strengthen <u>Equity and Inclusion</u> that are key learning components of the <u>VSB Ed. Plan 2026</u> as well as our <u>Four Pillars of Learning</u> and the <u>School Plan</u> here at Byng.

The VSB will create an equitable learning environment where every child can experience a deep sense of belonging and is free to pursue pathways of learning in ways that are authentic to themselves. (VSB Ed. Plan 2026)



February is Black History Month

Each year this unique learning opportunity provides students with a chance to research and learn about Black History in Canada and throughout the world.

Here is a quick snapshot of some of the projects and learning opportunities from the week just passed:

Daily PA Broadcasts Celebrate Black Excellence

Staff and Students Study Black History Through Research Projects and class-based learning opportunities.

What pedagogical practices can we use to support all our learners?

Black History Month

Mr. Andy Johnston began the school's Black History Month acknowledgements with the first broadcast of the month of February.

The broadcast gave an overview of the life and career of Canadian jazz musician Oscar Peterson:

Oscar Emmanuel Peterson CC CQ OOnt (August 15, 1925 – December 23, 2007)^[1] was a Canadian jazz pianist and composer. Considered a <u>virtuoso</u> and one of the greatest jazz pianists of all time, Peterson released more than 200 recordings, won eight <u>Grammy Awards</u>, as well as a lifetime achievement award from the <u>Recording Academy</u>, and received numerous other awards and honours. He played thousands of concerts worldwide in a career lasting more than 60 years. He was called the "<u>Maharaja</u> of the keyboard" by <u>Duke Ellington</u>, simply "O.P." by his friends, and informally in the jazz community, "the King of inside swing".

While students were introduced to our Month of acknowledgement and celebration of Black History by our Senior History teacher Mr. Andy Johnston, staff took

this opportunity to embrace our school's Inclusion and Diversity Pillar of learning

through class based learning and deep learning opportunities. One example of this was in Ms. Michelle Moldowan's Grade 8 English classes where each student researched an individual and then created a picture poster board outside of the school library.

Here is an update on the project from Ms. Moldowan:

Ms. Moldowan's Grade 8 Byng Arts English class celebrated Black Excellence Day by creating infographics highlighting accomplishments and contributions made by Black Canadians. Students have been working on developing writing and design processes to plan, develop and create engaging and meaningful literary and information texts.



Here are some examples form Ava Rudd and Nina Turin in Grade 8:

When I designed this poster for Black Excellence Day, my goal was to highlight the impactful contributions of Viola Desmond. Viola, the first Canadian woman featured on a Canadian banknote, played a crucial role in advancing the rights of people of color in Canada.

This poster is a tribute to Viola's strength and passion, aiming to reflect her values and the impact she had.

Nina Turin also in Grade 8 shares her thoughts on her experience of deep learning in the class:

I was assigned a project in my Byng Arts English class with Ms. Moldowan to do some research on an inspiring Black

person who has or had an impact on Canada for Black Excellence Day and Black History

Month. I chose to focus on Fabienne Colas who is a Haitian-born model, actress, director and producer who lives in Montréal. I found her story inspiring and enjoyed learning more about her and her achievements. I think it's important that we continue to recognize and celebrate people from all backgrounds who have faced challenges and persevered to



achieve impressive things. I enjoy projects where I get to do research and learn about living people who have made an impact on our communities.

Another important event that will be taking place this month for the celebration of Black History in Canada will be a Cultural Bridging workshop facilitated by Nigerian American community member Adaeze Opotu Anu.

Adaeze was at Byng last year for Black History Month and joined the Grade 8 camp last fall to facilitate the Cultural Bridging workshops that were expereinced by all Grade 8s as part of their 2 day orientation to the school.

This year Adaeze will be working with staff and students to facilitate a school wide workshop on the theme of Cultural Allyship.

Here is a summary of the Cultural Bridging Program:

The Building Cultural Bridges program will provide Lord Byng students with the knowledge, skills, and tools to recognize, challenge, and work toward dismantling racism and bias in their communities. By promoting understanding and respect for diverse cultures and experiences and empowering students to take action against racism, this program aims to create a more just and equitable community.

Adaeze Oputa Anu is the founder of the <u>Empowered Black Girl Program</u> in which Byng students took part during last year's summer Program.

Safety Sub Committee Update

A new safety sub-committee has been struck and has begun some work to help bring about some long overdue changes to our busy school streets. The committee has forwarded some excellent ideas and suggestions from parents at the recent PAC meeting for consideration. Improved safety along our busy 16th avenue corridor continues to be at the forefront of everyone's mind and we have so far received some feedback from CREST, a joint venture between ICBC and the VPD. There are some potential road safety education programs available to our students and to the new drivers in our Byng community as well as some scheduled speed enforcement from our local community policing volunteers with some potential follow up by the VPD as well. The CBC has also reported that the City of Vancouver is also committed to installing a crosswalk at the corner of 16th and Wallace in early 2025. The committee will be meeting next week and is open to all our parents' suggestions. 
