Sharmarke Dubow and Dr. Alexandra Bastiany

#### Inclusion and Diversity

What pedagogical practices can we use to support all our learners?



A native of Somalia, Sharmarke Dubow fled civil war at the age of 8 and spent 20 years as a refugee seeking haven in East and North Africa until Canada offered him a home in 2012.

A year after becoming a Canadian citizen, Dubow voted in his first election and also won a city council seat in Victoria, B.C. He is the first Somali-born Canadian elected to a Canadian city council and is the first Black councilor from Victoria in 152 years.

Dubow has extensive experience serving refugee and immigrant populations and community development. Nationally, he has served on the Executive Committee of the Canadian Council for Refugees. He has volunteered with various organizations and groups, including the steering committee of the Crime Reduction and Education (CRED) Program, Steering Committee for the Pacific Centre Family Services Association, and the Victoria Tenant Action Group.



Dr. Alexandra Bastiany is a cardiologist at Thunder Bay Regional Health Centre.

She earned her medical degree and completed her Internal medicine and Cardiology training at the Université de Montréal (UdeM). She graduated with honors, as the UdeM Faculty of Medicine first Black valedictorian.

Dr. Bastiany then successfully completed a fellowship in Interventional Cardiology at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute (University of Alberta) in Edmonton, making her the first Black female Canadian Interventional Cardiologist.

Dr. Bastiany is fluent in English, French, and Haitian Creole. She was born and raised in Montreal, QC of Haitian parents and developed a strong interest in community work amongst visible minorities.

Combining her expertise in cardiovascular disease and her passion for community work, Dr. Bastiany is actively working to decrease the race and gender biases leading to differences in standard of care and clinical outcomes.

Another valuable learning opportunity for both staff and students BHM was on display in the Library/Learning Commons:

Celebrating and acknowledging Black History Month this year, Ms. Rezler and Ms. Moldowan have created a special collection of books, archival resources and online materials for students and staff to find access to information for the month of February (BHM) as well as throughout the year!

#### Senior Honours Art Trip to see Denyse Thomasos: Just Beyond

Over forty students from the Byng Arts Senior Honours Art class travelled to the Vancouver Art Gallery this week to see this career retrospective of the late Trinidadian-Canadian artist Denyse Thomasos (1964–2012).

The exhibit features more than 60 paintings and works on paper from her career. This included monumental canvases as well as more intimate small sketches and articles from the artist's studio (paint containers, her favorite shoes, and works that were in process at the time of her death).

The exhibition was organized chronologically, and we were able to see how she grew from a talented young artist of 16 (the same age as the students on the tour) into a powerful and thought-provoking painter and activist. Her work presented challenging images documenting the Black experience in Canada and the United States through explorations of enslavement, confinement, and activism. Students were asked to not only consider the work on display but to also consider why few of them had ever heard of this female artist of colour and what it means to be unheard and unnoticed.

The Tool Kit has been very carefully curated by members of the Musqueam Nation as well as museum staff from the Museum of Anthropology at UBC.

Another <u>important resource</u> for teaching was included to support the Tool Kit and was reviewed during the rich day of professional engagement.

As well as rich professional development opportunities such as the Musqueam visit, staff and students at Byng continue to be supported by frequent opportunities to engage with Indigenous community members that support and assist learning for students through storytelling and project-based learning, like the recent Media Arts video project.

One example of this took place recently in a Senior English First Peoples Class with a visit from Lakota Metis Indigenous artist and educator Mr. Ray Mckeown.

Senior Grade 11 English students listen to teachings from Indigenous Elder in Residence Mr. Ray Mckeown. Ray has been at Byng for the past two years and has become a valued member of the learning community at the school.

Individual grants are set at \$2,000 for single school initiatives and go up to \$4,000 for proposals that include more than one VSB school.


