Byng Acknowledges Two Inspirational Canadian Leaders


A special tribute was made this week by our Social Studies Department Head Mr. Andy Johnston to honor two inspirational Canadian leaders that recently passed away.

The first was former premier of British Columbia Mr. John Horgan who is remembered for his leadership through Truth and Reconciliation in becoming the first province to acknowledge the United Nations Declaration for the Rights of

Indigenous Peoples. The second leader that was also recognized was Murray Sinclair the Truth and Reconciliation Commissioner.

Thank you, Mr. Johnston, for all the continued work that you do to support our Byng Learning Community through the daily PA Broadcasts that you and your students do to provide us with school information and important news such as the recent tribute to these two important Canadian leaders.

Byng Arts Career Education Celebrates Learning Through the Arts





This week students in the Byng Arts Program had an opportunity to meet with representatives from four post-secondary institutions and to hear about their personal learning journeys as they successfully navigated from high school and began their careers in the arts.

This event was organized by the head of Byng Arts, Mr. Jon Hartley-Folz, and Career Education Coordinator and teacher Ms. Kim Chong-Ping. The panel began by sharing their own individual stories and answering questions from the audience. Highlights included some very important strategies reinforcing the message that art in Vancouver has many avenues for students to pursue careers in through design, theatre, musical production, film making and a host of other avenues.

One very strong message that was repeated by each presenter was to have a strong passion and that the pathways for learning would open once they discovered the direction that they wished to pursue. This learning opportunity aligns well

with the guidelines from the Ministry of education in helping to cultivate the lifelong learning attributes of the Educated Citizen as described in the curriculum guide for the Career Education 10-12 Program below:

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Purposeful career-life development

For most people, career-life planning will not be a matter of making one major decision and living with it for a lifetime. Educated citizens in today's world are open to multiple possibilities for the future, and are flexible and able to adapt to emerging opportunities that fit their overarching values and aspirations. The CLE and CLC curricula are designed to help students learn how to effectively manage their life journey toward several possible preferred futures. Through purposeful career-life development, students learn to recognize their evolving interests and strengths, refine their learning goals, and apply this self-knowledge to exploration of post-graduation possibilities in diverse educational, work-related, and personal life contexts. In this way, students are able to advance toward who and how they want to be in the world.

The CLE and CLC learning standards reflect a thorough preparation for students, including:


- · experiential learning and community networking
- · exploration of multiple career-life roles and personal life/work balance
- · flexible planning for preferred post-graduation possibilities
- reflection on their learning experiences in school and out of school
- self-assessment of Core Competency development, including methods of organizing and maintaining authentic career-life evidence
- incorporation of inclusive practices and First Peoples perspectives/worldviews
- · ideas for deeper learning and open-ended discussions

21st Century learning in Action Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Mathematics

As the world around us continues to change so too is the need to adapt and review our teaching practices in line with both the challenges and opportunities of the 21st Century. At Byng we are truly fortunate to have teachers that continue to reflect and to revise their practice to keep up with the changes, a fact that is clear from the way in which the school has been quick to embrace the many curricula changes that have been introduced by the Ministry of Education.



Amongst the many required changes has been the introduction of the revised

Career Education 8-12 curriculum including the Capstone 12 Projects that have been a centre piece of learning for the past four years. Supporting that ability to change has been the addition of some important learning tools including an animation lab, a maker space for multi-disciplinary projects as well as a number of very important upgrades to our learning spaces including the auditorium as well as additional tools and equipment in the **Fine Arts, Engineering and the Applied Skills learning areas**


One of these initiatives that is in the design phase but would significantly improve the school's capacity to continue to support this evolution is the idea of creating an outdoor learning area that would allow staff and students to develop and deign large scale projects such as the construction of tiny homes, large scale carving projects and canoe building.





Here is just one of the designs (see below right) that has been created by our Applied Skills Department Head Mr. Bryan Erickson who has been working alongside VSB Maintenance and Construction staff to develop design ideas for this learning environment. Introducing projects of this kind and inviting community partners to assist (Emily Carr, UBC, BCIT etc.) will significantly support our school vision of creating 21st Learning opportunities for all students at Byng as outlined in the school's mission the Four Pillars of Learning.





Students at Byng already have access to a rich learning environment that draws on multiple areas of learning, some of which can take place in the newly upgrade multipurpose space Room 104 a (Engineering, ceramics, jewelry, metal work, wood and other integrated areas of teaching and learning):

Figure 2 Senior Capstone & Engineering student works on plans of the school, designing a 3-D Model of the school to submit as a final Capstone 12 School Project.




Figure 3 Multiple hands-on learning opportunities are currently available at the school.

Students Self-Reflect on their Core Competencies of Learning

Core Competency: Thinking

Definition

The Thinking competency encompasses the knowledge, skills, and processes we associate with intellectual development. It is through their competency as thinkers that students take subject-specific concepts and content and transform them into new understanding. Thinking competence requires specific thinking skills as well as habits of mind and metacognitive awareness. These are used to process information from a variety of sources, including thoughts and feelings that arise from the subconscious and unconscious mind and from embodied cognition to create new understandings.

Using a new learning platform recently introduced by the district students and staff took time following the Collaborative Planning session on Wednesday to support students to upload their self-reflections. The new platform for learning replaces a previous platform MyBlueprint and provides an opportunity to continue to reflect on their learning journey from Grades 8-12.

Here is a quick update on this transition for learning by Diane Phiilips:

This year, the VSB is switching platforms for reporting on the Core Competencies from MyEd to SpacesEdU. SpacesEDU is a platform created by the same company that created My Blueprint, which VSB staff and students have been using for Career Education for several years.

The SpaceEDU platform has a portfolio function where students can upload their evidence of learning. **Students can capture and upload evidence in a variety of formats: audio files, video files, text files, still photos - or multimedia**. However, it is essential that parents can understand what you are saying - so if a still photo, for example, does not clearly stand alone to show your thinking, please consider writing or recording a reflection or explanation to accompany it, and upload that as well.

Modern Languages students learn about French and Pacific Northwest Coast Art

The students in AP French had the opportunity to visit the Vancouver Art Gallery mainly the exhibition of Shelly Niro and Emilly Carr on Wednesday, Nov. 6. It was amazing to see some students making connections with their other courses and discussing projects they have done in First People English course while enjoying the work of Shelly Niro. By looking at Emily Carr's paintings, the students had an enriching experience of getting to see the works of a Canadian Artist that they will be comparing with a Francophone Artist.

"Shelley Niro: 500 Year Itch is the first major retrospective of work by the multimedia artist Shelley Niro, who grew up on the Six Nations Reserve, near Brantford, Ontario.

Spanning four decades of her photography, film, painting, installation, sculpture and mixed media practice, the exhibition highlights themes she constantly returns to: Matriarchy, Past is Present, Actors and Family Relations. Her persistent vision is to represent Indigenous women and girls, advocating for self-representation and sovereignty. Her highly empathetic approach moves viewers to understand the issues at hand through her visually impactful and politically powerful manner. She uses parody, feminism and spirituality to examine identity and, in turn, brings political power to the realm of the personal."


