


Figure 2 Active learning was a major part of planned activities for students this year with students walking from Langdale Ferry Terminal to Camp Elphinstone as well as participating in games, climbing on low and high ropes.



# **Career Education Conferences**


While staff and Grade 8 students were at camp, students at Byng were engaged in the annual **Career Education Conferences** that took place at the school over two full days of learning. These learning opportunities are essential for students planning to develop their skills as lifelong learners and provide students with knowledge, understanding and resources to make informed decisions about which courses they should take as well as next steps beyond high school.

Below is an update on the two days of active learning by Ms. Diane Phillips:

Byng hosted a Career Conference this week for our grade 9-12 students. On Thursday morning, Lee Taal, CEO of chatterhigh



presented to our grades 9 and 10 students about approaching their career journeys with adaptability and hope. He shared his own life and career story, and information about the <u>chatterhigh career exploration platform</u> that our students will have the opportunity to engage with this year.



On Thursday afternoon, the VSB Career Programs team, Ryan Fullerton, Mark Reid and Allison Newton, came in to present to our grades 10 and 11 students about opportunities for dual credits, apprenticeships and careers in the trades. On Friday morning, our grades 9 and 10 students watched The Social Dilemma to learn more about social media and the ways these platforms work to seek constant user engagement. We hope that this film provides students with ideas to reflect on and discuss with friends and family. Friday afternoon wrapped up with a presentation to our grades 10 and 11 students from the BC Federation of Labour on Work Safety.

#### How We COMBAT Vandalism

The Vancouver Board of Education:

- encourages residents living near schools to report to police any vandalism or suspicious activities at schools
- provides exterior security lighting and permanent electronic devices to monitor intrusion and fires in schools
- indentifies graffiti and provides photographs and evidence to police
- provides information leading to conviction of vandals
- cooperates with the police, courts, and other agencies for security patrols and court actions
- seeks restitution for the costs of vandalism
- These combined efforts have significantly reduced school vandalism; however, more progress may be made with your help.



#### **Culture is Not A Costume**

#### **HOW TO NOT CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE HALLOWEEN**

The autumn season is upon us, and soon it will be Halloween. This time of year brings with it many costume choice decisions. While dressing up is meant to be fun and exciting, it also runs the risk of offending others if costumes are offensive to other cultures. Halloween offers the opportunity to discuss costume choices with both colleagues and students. It is important not to inadvertently mimic culture by culturally appropriating racial or ethnic groups.

# **Examine your own practices**

Are you wearing a costume during Halloween? Ask yourself some critical questions about your costume. "Is my costume based on someone's race, ethnicity, or culture? Am I reinforcing stereotypes with the image I am portraying? Is my costume exploiting another culture?"

#### **CULTURAL APPROPRIATION**

- The taking from a culture that is not one's own of intellectual property, cultural expressions or artifacts, history and ways of knowledge (Ziff & Rao, 1997).
- Any instance which means commonly associated with and/or perceived as belonging to another are used to further one's own ends (Shugart, 1997).
- To take parts (symbols, artifacts, dress, words, practices, etc.) from a culture that is not your own. This can
  happen in a variety of forms but often around Halloween it involves wearing 'costumes' that may have some
  significance to other cultures.
- A particular power dynamic in which members of a dominant culture take elements from a culture of people who have been systematically oppressed by that dominant group.

#### **Digital Devices Policies**

One of the most significant changes for students this school year is the introduction of the recently mandated digital devices policies. This policy was outlined by the Superintendent in the letter sent to families on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024.

Students and staff reviewed the policy during assemblies and homeroom classes in which the key highlights were explained.

#### These included the following requirements for all students:

- Personal digital devices are not to be used without the direct permission of the teacher and/or administrator
- If a personal digital device is required for instructional purposes, or to support a student's medical needs, accessibility or accommodation staff will provide clear guidelines and expectations around their use for these purposes and ensure that use is adequately supervised.
- Ideally, personal digital devices should be left at home to reduce the risk of theft.

This policy applies during all instructional time and staff will continue to remind students of our <u>school code of conduct</u> regarding the use of personal digital devices.

As with all other policies regarding school conduct, we appreciate parents for your support as we implement this new policy mandated by the Ministry of Education.

- please do not use the drive through at the Lord Byng front entrance


If you need to drop off your child, please consider doing so a few blocks away. We appreciate your cooperation in making sure that the safety of your child is of the utmost importance to us
