# **Grade 10 Science Students Build a Rube Goldberg Machine**

Students in Mr. Koscal's Science 10 classes had an opportunity to engage in an exciting hands-on

science learning opportunity creating a machine chain reaction. The machines designed by the students are known as **Rube Goldberg machines**.

Rube Goldberg machines are named after American cartoonist <u>Rube Goldberg</u>, and is a <u>chain reaction</u>—type machine or

contraption intentionally designed to perform a simple task in an indirect and (impractically) overly complicated way. Usually, these machines consist of a series of simple unrelated devices; the action of each triggers the initiation of the next, eventually resulting in achieving a stated goal.

# **Career Education 8-12**

**Career Education 8-12** is a Program that provides essential skills for lifelong learning and provide students with a variety of experiences that align with the **Core Competencies** of Learning that are part of the prescribed curriculum goals for this program (see below).

The Program at Byng is run by two Program Coordinators **Mr. Sean Nugent** and **Ms. Kim Chong- Ping** who provides a summary of the Program below:

"We run a very robust career program at Lord Byng Secondary, at all grade levels."

Students begin their career education journey in Grade 8 with Mr. Raoul, as a part of the applied skills rotation. Mr. Raoul focusses on developing good citizenship and having students engage with the community, and they practice writing a professional letter.

Then in Grade 9, students work with Diane Phillips, and begin getting to know themselves, their interests, skills, and begin some career exploration on an online career platform called My blueprint. They get real life experience by job shadowing someone when they participate in "Take your Kids to work day".

Our program continues in Grade 10, when students work with a team of teachers in CLE 10. Students use a career online platform called Chatterhigh to learn about career exploration, financial literacy, work life balance, work safety. Students develop and refine their employability skills by learning how to write a resume, cover letter, and participate in a mock job interview with a community member. Students further their career exploration by conducting an informational interview with a mentor in a career field of interest and completing a job research assignment. Students switch gears near the end of course, and begin Capstone preparation, which entails thinking of a Capstone topic, meeting with their CLE 10 teachers to discuss their Capstone idea and planning a draft proposal.

In Grade 11, our students complete CLC (Career Life Connections) and work with a mentor and complete over 30 hours of experiential learning as they complete their Capstone. The Capstone Project is a culminating project of our Career program, and a central focus of our program. Students have the opportunity to choose a topic of interest to them, plan, problem solve and execute their project while working alongside a mentor and a CLC teacher advisor. This project could be an extension of something that they learned in another class, or it could be a passion project unrelated to a school course. Although this project is completely self-driven, we have a very structured program to ensure student success and accountability. Students get an opportunity to showcase their learning and their projects at our annual Capstone Fair in June where all of our junior grades will also get to visit. Our junior grades have an opportunity to talk with the Grade 11 students about their Capstone and be inspired for their future Capstone Projects. This is a community event, and parents and mentors are invited to see the learning and achievements of our Capstone students.

In Grade 11 and 12, students can continue their Career Ed Journeys by taking Work Experience with Ms. Sahdra. In this course, students get real life experience in the work force as they complete work placements in fields of interest. Students can experience working in a law firm, vet clinic, architect firm etc, to see if they want to pursue a career in a specific field. For some students, it is a good opportunity to gain valuable life experience beyond the classroom. In addition to coordinating the work placements, Ms. Sahdra also hosts industry related workshops, and helps students with their resume writing, job interview skills etc.

We have a unique Career Education model at Byng. Almost all of our career classes are delivered off timetable and are not a bum in seat class. We deliver our courses through assemblies during FIT, individual meetings, and through online career platforms. This gives students the flexibility to take other electives on timetable. Our Career Ed teachers work collaboratively and are very much team oriented. In addition to our regular Career Ed programming, we offer Byng Arts focused Career Ed classes at the Grade 10-12 level, where special presentations and workshops related to the arts are planned and held in the Byng Arts Gallery.

Thanks Ms. Kim Chong-Ping for this important update and thank you to all the staff that work to make this program an exemplary model of learning at our school and in the Vancouver School District.

#### **Digital Devices Policies**

One of the most significant changes for students this school year is the introduction of the recently mandated digital devices policies. This policy was outlined by the Superintendent in the letter sent to families on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024.

Students and staff reviewed the policy during assemblies and homeroom classes in which the key highlights were explained.

#### These included the following requirements for all students:

- Personal digital devices are not to be used without the direct permission of the teacher and/or administrator
- If a personal digital device is required for instructional purposes, or to support a student's medical needs, accessibility or accommodation staff will provide clear guidelines and expectations around their use for these purposes and ensure that use is adequately supervised.
- Ideally, personal digital devices should be left at home to reduce the risk of theft.

This policy applies during all instructional time and staff will continue to remind students of our <u>school code of conduct</u> regarding the use of personal digital devices.

As with all other policies regarding school conduct, we appreciate parents for your support as we implement this new policy mandated by the Ministry of Education.

- please do not use the drive through at the Lord Byng front entrance


If you need to drop off your child, please consider doing so a few blocks away. We appreciate your cooperation in making sure that the safety of your child is of the utmost importance to us



The passport is a fun, but mandatory part of our program at Byng Arts. Byng Arts Passports are reviewed every January and May and students are expected to have recorded seven or more events for each submission date. Here are some of the most recent options:



Each student has a new account that uses your student number as your username. We have posted log in instructions on Teams and have also included them here:

- 1. Go to the Passport Site: http://passport.lordbyng.net
- 2. Use your Student Number as your USERNAME.
- 3. PASSWORDS are already set and follow the following set of rules:

Most follow this default pattern:

- Last name + underscore + last 3 digits of your student number
  - For Hermione Granger this would be: Granger\_242

Once you are in, take a screenshot and submit it for your first badge: The Master Code Breaker Achievement. Post a profile picture (make sure it is a small size and submit a screen shot as well to unlock the Best Face Forward Badge. Now get out there and start recording your interactions with the arts!

Two situations where things are slightly different:

- if your <u>last name is 5 letters in length or less</u> things are different, use:
  - Last name + underscore + first name + underscore + last three digits of your Student number
    - For Cho Chang this would be: Chang\_Cho\_123
- if your student number ends in three digits that are the same (11223666), use the first three digits instead of the last three (only 6 or 7 of you are in this situation).
  - For Lucius Malfoy, his password is Malfoy\_112
