Highlights for the month of September include special recognition for our responsibility as teachers and as citizens of Canada to acknowledge our collective responsibility to continue our Truth and Reconciliation journey.

As a school our Truth and Reconciliation Pillar of Learning provides an important pathway for learning and as Truth and Reconciliation conciliation commissioner <u>Murray Sinclair</u> stated:

"Education is what got us into this mess — the use of education at least in terms of residential schools — but education is the key to reconciliation," he said.

"We need to look at the way we are educating children. That's why we say that this is not an aboriginal problem. It's a Canadian problem."

This call to action is precisely why the work we do with our students here at Byng supporting our **Truth and Reconciliation Pillar of Learning** is so important.

Thank you to all the staff and students that have taken time through the lens of their curriculum areas to acknowledge the impact of the Residential School experience on survivors and the acknowledge the victims of this historic injustice that continues to impact Indigenous communities throughout our country.

Truth and Reconciliation Through Indigenous Teaching and Learning

How do we authentically promote, embrace, and engage with the First Peoples Principles of Learning in our classrooms? Students throughout the school having been working alongside Indigenous Elders, Knowledge Keepers, artists and other community members to support their learning. This alignment with the TRC's call to action is evident throughout the school with students taking initiatives of their own to acknowledge the land as well as taking on opportunities to reach out to survivors.

One example of this is taking place with Ms. Shaw's Textiles class.

One group of students from the school are acknowledging the land by distributing buttons that they had made through the help of Indigenous community in China.

The buttons were made as a way of creating fair trading relationships with communities outside of Canada. Here is an update on the project from the students:

Truth and Reconciliation Through Indigenous Teaching and Learning

How do we authentically promote, embrace, and engage with the First Peoples Principles of Learning in our classrooms?

We are the Lord Byng Fair Trade Club, and our latest project involves creating badges featuring our school logo. These badges include hand-embroidered details and are being made by artisans in impoverished remote areas. We have collaborated with talented artisans from the Yao minority ethnic group in Guizhou Province, China. These artisans, specifically from the Raojia subgroup, are renowned for their intricate and vibrant embroidery work, which has been passed down through generations. Despite their incredible craftsmanship, many of these artisans face economic challenges due to their remote location and limited market access.

We initiated this project to raise awareness about fair trade and provide support to artisans in remote areas, helping to improve their livelihoods. We will be distributing these badges on campus and providing one badge to each staff member as a token of appreciation. We are thrilled to share this meaningful project with our community!

Poisonous Plants

Grounds staff have identified and removed plants growing on VSB grounds which are toxic and represent a serious health hazard, if ingested. Unfortunately, as these plants may appear at any time, it is not possible for ground staff to eliminate this hazard entirely from school grounds. It is important to note these plants occur naturally in areas

throughout the lower mainland and may be present in areas frequented on field trips and beyond the control of VSB or Grounds department.

Below is some information on two of the hazardous plants. It is important to be familiar with their appearance.

<u>Belladonna or Deadly Nightshade</u> has been found at several schools. A herbaceous perennial with oval, pointed leaves, purplish flowers and black, shining berries. The entire plant contains toxic alkaloids; potentially fatal, especially in children.

Digital Devices Policies

One of the most significant changes for students this school year is the introduction of the recently mandated digital devices policies. This policy was outlined by the Superintendent in the letter sent to families on August 22nd, 2024.

Students and staff reviewed the policy during assemblies and homeroom classes in which the key highlights were explained.

These included the following requirements for all students:

- Personal digital devices are not to be used without the direct permission of the teacher and/or administrator
- If a personal digital device is required for instructional purposes, or to support a student's medical needs, accessibility or accommodation staff will provide clear guidelines and expectations around their use for these purposes and ensure that use is adequately supervised.
- Ideally, personal digital devices should be left at home to reduce the risk of theft.

This policy applies during all instructional time and staff will continue to remind students of our <u>school code of conduct</u> regarding the use of personal digital devices.

As with all other policies regarding school conduct, we appreciate parents for your support as we implement this new policy mandated by the Ministry of Education.

Medical Conditions / Care Plan Forms

If your son/daughter has a medical condition: diabetes, seizures, anaphylaxis, asthma, or other medical concerns, please come to the office to pick up a medical care plan form. It is important that the school is informed of any medical condition that may require emergency care at school and have updated information on file.

It is strongly recommended that students who carry emergency medications such as inhalers, epi-pens or diabetic emergency kits keep these medications or supplies with them at all times in a fanny pack, purse or backpack which travels to class and on field trips with them.




MyEd BC

Access will be available to all students after 3:00 pm, August 30, 2024. All existing accounts have been re-enabled with the new expiry date of **31-July-2025**. Should you forget your password, click the "I forgot my password" function. A new system generated password will be sent to your email account.

All NEW students at Lord Byng school for school year 2024-2025 are to log in using their student number. All new accounts will have the default password of **Dist\$2025** (case sensitive). After you login you will be asked to create a new password. You will also need to provide an email address. It is highly recommended to use your District provided VSB email – student#@learn.vsb.bc.ca (eg: 12345@learn.vsb.bc.ca)

Lockers

Student Instructions to select locker online:

- 1. It is recommended that students use a school lock. These are available for purchase from the office. Payment for locks can be made via School Cash Online.
- 2. Go to locker administration website for the school. This website will be live as of September 3, 2024
- 3. Login using your student number as the user id and your initials and student number as the password. For example, if your name is "John Smith" and your student number is 12345, your user id would be "12345" and your password would be "JS12345". The password is case sensitive!
- 4. Zones of the school are already designated by grades. Note that as the availability of lockers in a zone the zone buttons will change from **Yellow** (many lockers available), to **Orange** (over 50% of lockers capacity assigned) to **Red** (no lockers available in zone other than your grade).
- 5. Before you can select your locker, please enter the combination of the lock you will be using with dashes in a format such as "00-00-00".
- 6. All available lockers will be listed in the zone designated for your grade. A locker entry that is **Green** is an empty locker, and a locker entry that is **Orange** has at least one person in the locker already. ie Grade 10 students will be required to share their locker with their preferred locker partner.
- 7. Once you have selected a locker, you can login at any time to see your assigned locker and combination.
- 8. You cannot change your locker through the online application.

Daily, FIT (Flexible Instructional Time)

FIT time is a period of instructional time built into the Lord Byng schedule that gives our students the opportunity to have choice in their learning time. Examples of some ways to use FIT time include:

- Meeting with teachers for support in subject learning or completing assignments
- Connecting with counsellors
- Individual study time
- Work Experience 11 and 12

- Attending tutorial sessions
- Collaborating with peers on projects
- Career Education lessons and meetings
- Enrichment passion projects

Ultimately, FIT time empowers our students to take ownership of their own learning and gives them the opportunity to develop core competencies such as personal responsibility, self-regulation, goal setting, wellbeing, and communication.




Byng Arts Passport

The passport is a fun, but mandatory part of our program at Byng Arts. Byng Arts Passports are reviewed every January and May and students are expected to have recorded seven or more events for each submission date.

Here are some of the most recent options:



Each student has a new account that uses your student number as your username. We have posted log in instructions on Teams and have also included them here:

- 1. Go to the Passport Site: http://passport.lordbyng.net
- 2. Use your <u>Student Number</u> as your USERNAME.
- 3. PASSWORDS are already set and follow the following set of rules:

Most follow this default pattern:

- Last name + underscore + last 3 digits of your student number
 - For Hermione Granger this would be: Granger_242

Once you are in, take a screenshot and submit it for your

first badge: The Master Code Breaker Achievement.

Two situations where things are slightly different:

- if your <u>last name is 5 letters in length or less</u> things are different, use:
 - Last name + underscore + first name + underscore + last three digits of your Student number
 - For Cho Chang this would be: Chang_Cho_123
- 2. if your student number ends in three digits that are the same (11223666), use the first three digits instead of the last three (only 6 or 7 of you are in this situation).
