Black History Month Announcements celebrate Black Excellence

Inclusion and Diversity

What pedagogical practices can we use to support all our learners?

Each week throughout the month of February the PA Team sponsored by Mr. Andy Johnston provides acknowledgements of prominent Black leaders.

Last week's updates included:

Emma Stark, Honorable Lincoln M. Alexander, and Barbara Howard Thanks, Mr. Johnston, and your PA team, for these important BHM updates!!!

Feature for Tuesday, February 20st

Today's Black History month feature personality is Emma Stark. Emma was born on February 17, 1856 in California, at the age of 4 she



arrived in Salt Spring Island with her parents Sylvia and Louis Stark and her brother Willis. On Salt Spring Island, 4 other siblings were born: In 1875, the family moved to Cedar, in the Nanaimo area where Stark attended Salt Spring Island Central School, and she completed high school at Nanaimo High School, at a time when a high school certificate was the required qualification for teaching.

On August 1, 1874, at the age of 18, Emma became the first black teacher on Vancouver

Feature for Wednesday, February 21st

Today's Black History month feature personality is the Honourable Lincoln M. Alexander who was born in Toronto in 1922 passing away in 2012, at the age of 90. During his



life, Lincoln Alexander served with the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War. Later, he became the first Black person to become a Member of Parliament in 1968 and served in the House of Commons until 1980. He was also federal Minister of Labour in 1979– 1980.

In 1985, Lincoln Alexander was appointed Ontario's 24th Lieutenant Governor, the first member of a racialized community to serve as

Island and she was hired to teach in a one-room schoolhouse in the Cedar district.

Sadly, Emma Stark died in 1890 at the age of 33 due to an undetermined illness. A plaque in recognition of her teaching career is located at 331 Wesley Street, Nanaimo where Emily lived. the Queen's representative in Canada. The Honourable Lincoln Alexander was appointed a Companion of the Order of Canada in 1992!

On December 2013, the Province of Ontario proclaimed January 21 (Lincoln Alexander's birthday) as "Lincoln Alexander Day" and the following year, the Day was nationally recognized.

Feature for Friday, February 23rd

Today's Black History month feature personality is Barbara Howard. Born and raised in Vancouver at 10th and Nanaimo. During the late 1930s, the Vancouver-born Howard was one of the fastest female sprinters in the British Empire. She represented Canada at the 1938 British Empire Games in Sydney, Australia. Howard later graduated from UBC in 1959 attaining a B.Ed. and was the first member of a visible minority hired by the Vancouver School Board.



She worked as a Vancouver school teacher until 1984. In her later years, she remained active in the community volunteering as a peer counsellor. She was inducted into the BC Sports Hall of Fame in 2012 and inducted into the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame in 2015.

With Black History Month as an opportunity to develop and support the school's anti-racism education program the theme of Allyship was the focus of the recent staff meeting. Staff at the meeting were introduced to this theme constructed by community facilitator Adaeze Oputa Anu.

Students throughout the school will learn about Allyship through an important workshop facilitated by staff on March 5th during FIT time.





One example of action by students at the school to act and to build Allyship in the school is taking place on Tuesday during the Multicultural Fair. The Multicultural Fair was one of the initiatives that was suggested by students participating in the Youth Panel facilitated by Adaeze Oputa Anu during last year's BHM Youth panel discussion.

Engineering Students find out about the Laws of Physics, Bridge Building, and the Structural Integrity of Spaghetti!

Engineering students in Mr. Yates Lo's Senior Engineering classes have already started the first of several hands-on learning opportunities during the semester.

Student Engagement

How do we build student curiosity and imagination in the process of lifelong learning? The Engineering class is unique in the school as the students taking the class can put theory directly into action through working in the wood and metal shops.

Mr. Lo first teaches students the factual theoretical information in the classroom and then with the support and help of the Applied Skills teacher Mr. Erickson in the wood shop next door and the adjacent metal shop run by Mr. Matt Barski the students can put their theory into action using the shop tools.

With safety of course always being a guiding principle in the shop environment, students are not using these tools until they have completed their safety tests for both shops. Instead, they are currently working on building bridges out of spaghetti, yes that is right and no this is not a foods class!

The students working in teams are each given the same amount of dried pasta and a glue gun. The job is to follow the criteria for the bridge given by the project



guidelines and to build the strongest bridge possible using the knowledge that they have learned about the laws of physics and applied mechanics.

Once the bridges are built, they will be put to the test by Mr. Lo using the weight testing device.


