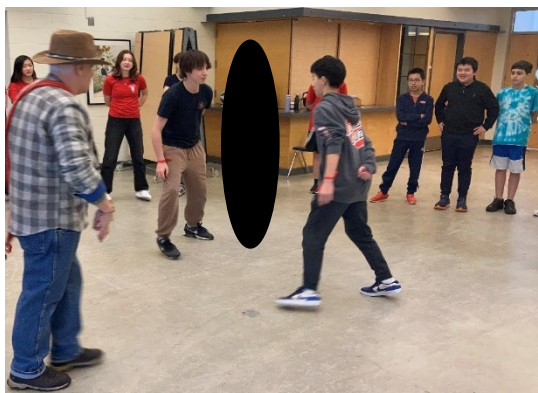


Figure 4 Mr. Ray McKeown teaches the First Peoples Principles of Learning with students in Mr. Boulding's PE 8 Class

International Women's Day

Special Acknowledgement were made on Friday for International Women's Day including the recognition of some very remarkable female leaders:

- Bernice Carnegie
- Dr. Victoria Lee
- Vanessa Génir



Bernice Carnegie is the co-founder and president of [The Carnegie Initiative \(CI\)](#), an organization named after her father, the legendary Canadian hockey player and changemaker Herb Carnegie. Continuing the work her father started over 60 years ago, the CI is on a mission to continue to make hockey accessible, inclusive, and diverse. Bernice unveils the rich tapestry of her family’s journey on her personal website and in the co-authored autobiography, [A Fly in a Pail of Milk: The Herb Carnegie Story](#). In the book, she reveals how her life was shaped by lessons passed on from father to daughter, celebrating the indelible contributions of Black Canadians throughout the course of the nation’s history. In 2022, Bernice was chosen as one of the top [22 most influential people in hockey](#) in North America. Bernice etched her name in history as part of the groundbreaking BIPOC ownership of a professional women’s hockey team, the [Toronto Six](#), in 2021.



Dr. Victoria Lee is the president and CEO of [Fraser Health](#), one of the largest and most complex health service delivery systems in Canada. She is responsible for the strategic direction and operations of integrated health services that are provided by 48,000 people who serve a diverse population of more than two million people in the region. Dr. Lee bridges cultural divides to foster an environment of innovation, inclusivity, and impact. Under Dr. Lee’s leadership, transformative changes have occurred at the organization including a system-wide digital twin, planetary health strategy, and over \$10 billion in multi-year large capital investments.



Vanessa Génier is the CEO & founder of [Quilts for Survivors](#), a grassroots initiative that honours survivors of Canada’s Residential School system. Vanessa is a member of the Missanabie Cree First Nation and had a direct ancestry connection to survivors of Ontario’s residential school system. With an initial goal of creating 215 quilts to honour the 215 unmarked graves recovered in Kamloops, British Columbia, Since 2021, Vanessa and her global team of volunteers have presented over 4,500 quilts to survivors across Canada. A respected Founder and CEO, Vanessa will be presented with a Governor General’s Award for Meritorious Service Decorations, (Civil Division).

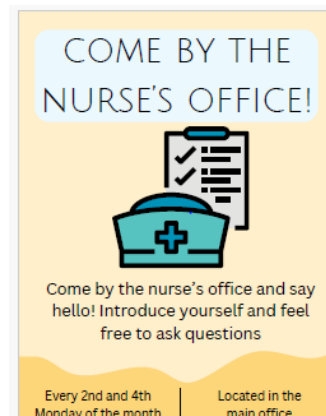

Competition days are also to be determined. A full schedule will be available after Spring Break.

Starting on Monday, March 4th we will be doing outdoor practices: Monday and Tuesdays at 3:30pm at Camosun Park and Wednesdays at 3:30pm at UBC.

The Track and Field team is the largest team in the school. It is co-ed and all grades. We don't make cuts (no one will be eliminated from the team). The team won 11 City Championships in a row ending in 2023. Last year, we placed second to Kitsilano, so this year we will try to recapture the title. 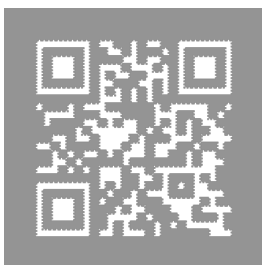
