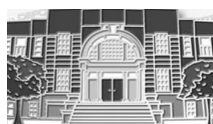

Celebrating Learning: Tennyson Basketball Teams Wrap Up their Season!

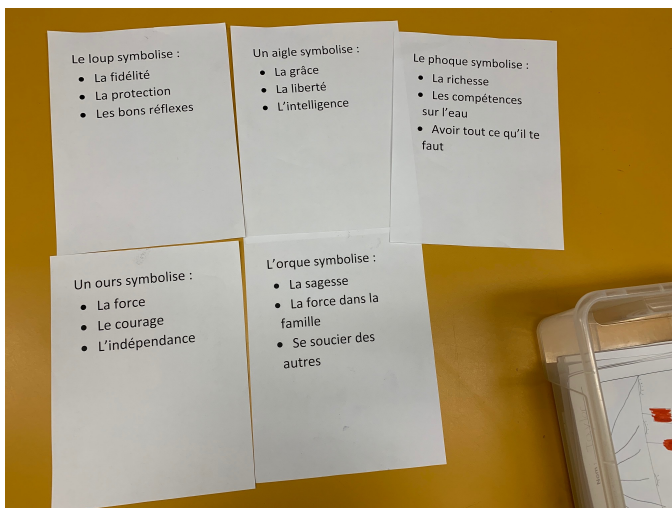
