Dear Strathcona Families,

As we head into spring, it is nice to see more daylight, warmer temperatures, better weather, and a two week break just around the corner! Strathcona is a very busy place. It was great to see a student led Pink Day assembly this past Wednesday, spreading the word of acceptance and standing up against bullying. A colleague of mine reminded us of the origin of Pink Shirt Day: The true origin of the day which was homophobic bullying of a student in Cambridge, Nova Scotia in 2007. He wore a pink shirt to school on the first day of Grade 8. Other students in Grade 12 who didn't know him stood up for him by wearing pink to school the next day to show solidarity for the student and let the bullies know that homophobia was not okay. Students started the Day of Pink.

At the school level, we continue to emphasize key messages around the school code of conduct which also connect to a zero tolerance policy towards bullying. Specific topics that continue to receive focus are valuing diversity, use of appropriate language, respect for adults and each other, appropriate conduct online and with social media. A key message for our senior students is to take on leadership and step up to create a culture at Strathcona they can be proud of.

Over the next couple of weeks, please be aware of some key events taking place: French Immersion Consolidation Proposals Open House on March 7th 3:30-7:00, PAC Meeting on March 13th, and the Multicultural Fair on March 14th. Hope to see a great turnout!

DAILY ATTENDANCE

Daily school attendance is important for all students. Students who attend school regularly are more engaged in learning, have a greater sense of belonging to the community and are more likely to graduate high school. Perfect attendance should be a goal because even missing two days of school a month works out to a student missing the equivalent of one month of school a year. Research shows that 18



school days missed can lead to one grade lost. Your child should attend school every day unless there is an unavoidable cause like illness. When children arrive at school on time they start the day off more positively. When children attend school consistently, they are able to build stronger relationships with their teachers and classmates. It is difficult to 'catch children up' when they miss a significant amount of teacher instruction because of late arrivals. In some cases, valuable teacher time can also be compromised and these late arrivals/absences impact the learning not only of the child who is absent/late but also of his/her classmates.

Hello parents,

The PAC has been very active this month!

VSB French Immersion proposal

The school board proposed in January to relocate the French Immersion program at Henry Hudson Elementary in Kitsilano to Strathcona. This would double the size of the French Immersion program here. We gathered feedback from parents at the PAC General Meeting on January 30th, and met with school board staff on February 25th to give feedback. We will present this to staff and trustees on March 6th.

The PAC Board does not support the proposal. It is missing significant details, and has a short timeline for parent engagement and for the VSB to consider parent feedback. We have concerns regarding resources and equity. The proposal seems to have been prepared from a numbers perspective rather than considering actual student and family needs, and physical space, at Strathcona.

Food4Schools

After learning that funding to the VSB's hot lunch program was dramatically cut, a Strathcona PAC sub-committee was struck to fight for this program. A city counselor proposed a short term solution to restore funding to the end of the school year. Strathcona parents, teachers and other concerned community members spoke to city council to oppose this cut. This bill will be voted on at a February 26 city council meeting. WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

Things to consider if your child feels unwell:

- 1. The protection of your child. Without proper rest a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be open to other illnesses.
- 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- 4. The protection of other children.

Please keep your child home if he/she:

- Has a fever.
- Is too sick to take part in all normal school activities.



- Has a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox, measles or any other undiagnosed rash).
- Keep your child home until they cannot infect others or as told by a health care provider.
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free at least 24 hours before returning to school.

Please let the school know your child's symptoms, as per the schools call back procedures.

If the school finds it necessary to send your child home because of illness, please make sure you have arranged an emergency contact if you are not available. Inform your school of these arrangements.
