They have been learning about whole numbers, fractions, percent concepts. Using the knowledge that they learned about probability, students incorporated their learning into designing carnival fun games for others to enjoy. COAST SALISH WEAVING

The grade 2s and 3s of Div 8 have been learning about traditional Coast Salish weaving, the art of creating textiles from thick strands of wool. It is an ancient practice that was done since time immemorial for countless years before colonization and continues today with new generations of weavers in local $x^wma\vartheta k^wayam$ (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish nation) communities. In the old days, the materials used included mountain goat hair, woolly dog hair (a species that is now extinct) and plant fibres, such as from cedar or willow trees. The materials



are dyed so that intricate patterns can be woven into the design. Modern weavers usually use sheep's wool. By engaging in hands-on learning, students learned that weaving is a skill that can be developed with patience and time. We worked on weaving our pouches over several weeks. (by Ms. Kinzel)

NEXT PAC MEETING


The next PAC meeting is **Tuesday, April 15 at 9:00 am** in the Staff Room (South Hill Swing Space). We are looking forward to seeing you.
