We have had two opportunities to practice the Student Reunification aspect of our drill, so we won't be practicing this at the drill next week. School Organization

We are in the process of planning for the 2025-26 school year. At the end of the month, teachers will be working to create new classes for September.


SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR UPDATE
