URGENT CALLOUT: YOUR GRENFELL PAC NEEDS HELP



Hello parents!

The PAC (Parent Advisory Committee) needs your help!

The parent who has been the Treasurer for the past few years is stepping down, having given notice at the beginning of this school year. The PAC

has been glad for her help in continuing to issue funds as needed, but they require an actively involved Treasurer who can attend meetings (either in person or virtually). This role is vital for both the PAC and the school. If they do not find someone to take over this position ASAP, they will be unable to continue providing the school with support next year.

Without an active Treasurer on the PAC, staff and students at Grenfell will miss out on some big things next year.

These include:

- The gaming grant from the BC government (\$8500 per year). These funds are only given to schools with at least 3 executives on their PACS, (they currently only have 2 parents filling "executive" roles)
- Hot Lunches without someone managing the finances, they will be unable to pay vendors.
- Funds for things like new laptops and other technology, new library books, music supplies, sport equipment and more.

In addition to needing a new Treasurer, the current **website manager** is also stepping down. This is a position that can be done entirely remotely by communicating with the PAC Secretary.

Please contact the PAC at grenfellpac@gmail.com if you can help in any way. They are happy to provide necessary training as you transition into this role. The benefits of getting involved in the PAC is ever lasting. Attending the PAC meetings is a great way to connect with other Grenfell families, and to learn about your child's school and programs through the principal updates at the PAC meetings and the opportunity for you to have a voice in your child's education.
